## Accounting Certificate Program

Accounting is one of the most popular majors at Bellarmine University. Our graduates are well prepared for professional accounting careers with Certified Public Accounting (CPA) firms, major corporations, and government or non-profit agencies. All of the “Big 4” international CPA firms, several regional firms, and all large local CPA firms in the Louisville area interview on campus and hire Bellarmine students. Many large Louisville, national and international businesses also interview on campus or request résumés. Many Bellarmine students obtain positions and acquire business experiences through paid internships before program completion.

The W. Fielding Rubel School of Business at Bellarmine University is accredited by AACSB International (Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business), which places it among the elite business schools in the nation. Bellarmine is the first and only private university in Kentucky to achieve AACSB accreditation. The Rubel School is also listed as one of *Princeton Review’s* “300 Best Business Schools.”

The Bellarmine Accounting Certificate program is designed to help graduates of bachelor’s programs complete Kentucky and Indiana state requirements for eligibility to take the CPA examination as quickly as possible without impairing the quality of education. The Certificate is a 3-semester, 24 credit hour program for students with a prior business degree in a field other than accounting, or a 5-semester, 39 credit hour program for students with no prior accounting or business coursework. Of course, the program is flexible; students can take one course at a time or be a full-time student. Both day and evening classes are available. There are no general education or incidental courses in the program.

### PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- A completed and signed application.
- A bachelor’s degree from an accredited college or university in a discipline other than accounting.
- Submit \$25 application fee (unless Bellarmine University alumni/a)
- Final official transcript(s) from each college or university attended should be mailed to the Office of Graduate Admission and not be marked “Issued to Student”.
- If any transcripts or undergraduate degree(s) are from an international institution you must provide an official copy of a third party course by course credential evaluation. The Office of Graduate Admission reserves the right to request a certified copy of the original transcript(s).
- If your undergraduate degree is from an international institution, you were born outside the United States, or English is your second language, you will be required to submit an official TOEFLiBT (internet-based test) score and receive a total score of 80 or higher. We will also consider an equivalent score on the IELTS or MELAB tests. The Admission, Progression and Graduation Committee reserves the right to require a TOEFL score from any applicant.
- Personal interview, if requested by the Accounting Certificate Admission, Progression and Graduation Committee.
- Provide one letter of recommendation from a faculty member and/or supervisor who knows you. A recommendation form is included in the packet.
- Submit a type written response to the essay question listed on the application.

## **INTERNATIONAL APPLICANTS**

**Please complete the items under Procedure for Admission and submit the following:**

U.S. law requires financial statements from a bank or other financial institution certifying the student's ability to fund the cost of attendance for one academic year minus the amount of any scholarship dollars received. Figures should be in U.S. dollars and must be certified as an official document by the bank or financial institution. A sponsor may be used if the sponsor attaches a signed affidavit stating that he/she will financially support the student until completion of a degree at Bellarmine University. If a sponsor is used, the sponsor's bank statement should accompany the letter. The amount that would need to be shown for the Accounting program would be \$48,802 for full-time students. The amount for part-time students would be \$26,661. These amounts include tuition and fees associated with the program and an average cost for living expenses, books, supplies, health insurance, transportation and personal expenses.

## **PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS**

- Completion of these five required courses totaling fifteen credits: ACCT 101, 211, 212, 313, 418.
- Fifteen credits selected from other accounting courses or BA 403.
- Nine additional credits selected from business administration or business-related courses.
- For all certificate students, a minimum of twenty-four accounting credits must be completed at Bellarmine.

## **TUITION, FINANCIAL AID, & THE CPA**

Students in this program are charged tuition on a per credit hour basis. The current tuition for the 2011-12 academic year is \$730 per credit hour for both full and part-time students taking business related courses.

### **Financial Aid**

- In addition to company tuition reimbursement plans and private bank loans, students are eligible for federal Stafford loans, both subsidized and unsubsidized after completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- Bellarmine's school code is 001954.

### **Kentucky CPA Exam Requirements**

- If you passed the Uniform CPA Examination as a Kentucky candidate, obtained 150 college semester hours, and completed 1 year of experience in an accounting or auditing position in public practice, academia, industry or government that can be verified by an actively licensed CPA of any state, you may apply for a Kentucky license.
- A year of experience is defined as 2000 hours in a period of not less than 12 months earned after the awarding of a baccalaureate degree.
- A certificate of experience may be submitted for more than one employment situation to meet the 1-year of experience. The CPA verifying your experience must have an active practicing license, but does not have to be your supervisor.

## **UNDERGRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN PROFESSIONAL ACCOUNTING**

Students who have previously completed a baccalaureate degree, in any field other than accounting, and wish to pursue professional careers in accounting will enter the undergraduate certificate in professional accounting program. Students complete a minimum of thirty-nine credits and may receive credit for up to fifteen hours based on their undergraduate coursework in business and accounting. The certificate program may be completed in one to two years, depending on previous coursework. To sit for the CPA examination in Kentucky, total accounting hours must equal 27, total business-related hours 39, and total college hours 150.

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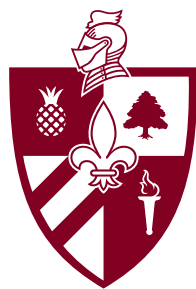
