

Assistant Professor of Biochemistry

The Department of Chemistry and Physics at Bellarmine University invites applications for a tenure track position at the rank of assistant professor effective August 15, 2012 in Biochemistry. The Ph.D. in biochemistry or a related field is required. Responsibilities include teaching biochemistry and advanced biochemistry in our Biochemistry and Molecular Biology program (a joint program with the Department of Biology) and other department courses as necessary.

While Bellarmine's first mission is teaching, successful candidates should also have an unquestionable commitment to the development of an undergraduate student based research program. Applicants should be aware that publication of results with co-author undergraduate students in peer reviewed journals is encouraged. Research instrumentation includes FT-NMR, FTIR, GC/MS, and others plus our newest acquisition of a Shimadzu single quadrupole HPLC-MS 2020 mass spec detector system. Bellarmine is a highly selective private liberal arts university in the Catholic tradition with an enrollment of 3,200 students. Bellarmine University is located in Louisville, Kentucky; is listed in the *Princeton Review's* 376 Best Colleges list, and is ranked 12th among Southern universities in the *U.S. News and World Report*.

The Department of Chemistry and Physics is a growing department. In the last five years we have added B.S. in Chemistry, a B.S. in Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, and a B.S. in Physics to complement our B.A. in Chemistry and Physics minor.
