Location

Graz, the second-largest city in Austria, is a center of science, industry, commerce and culture, and an important gateway to Southeastern Europe. The unique old town center with its Renaissance buildings and Baroque churches, inviting places, narrow streets and alleys has become a UNESCO World Heritage site. As European Cultural Capital 2003, Graz has seized its opportunities to present itself to a broader international audience as a city, living with a rich traditional heritage that has evolved over many centuries, and which has an impressive record of new attractions added to it.



Visas

International students from outside the European Union who stay in Austria for under 6 months need to apply for a 'visa D/C' through the Austrian Embassy or a Consulate in their country of residence



Students staying for longer than 6 months have to apply for a residence permit. US citizens can apply for the residence permit AFTER they arrive in Graz. The coordinator will inform nominated students which documentation they need to bring along. Approximate Cost: 110 Euro

Average Semester Course Load

Graz does not require a minimum or maximum number of courses. 24-30 ECTS credits per semester are considered a full-time load.

General Semester Dates:

Fall Semester: October-Late December/ early January.
Exams are the last week in January.

Spring Semester: Late February/March- June.
Exams are the last week in June.
