On behalf of the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE), I am pleased to advise you that the CCNE Board of Commissioners reviewed the continuous improvement progress report submitted on June 1, 2016 by the baccalaureate and master's degree programs in nursing at Bellarmine University and determined that the programs continue to meet all accreditation standards.

As a reminder, programs are expected to comply with <u>the current CCNE standards and</u> <u>procedures</u> throughout the period of accreditation. This includes advising CCNE in the event of any substantive change in the nursing programs or of any major organizational changes that may affect the programs' administration, scope, or quality. Substantive change notifications must be submitted to CCNE no earlier than 90 days prior to implementation or occurrence of the change, but no later than 90 days after implementation or occurrence of the change. These reporting requirements are discussed further in the CCNE *Procedures*.
