

HONORS PROGRAM UPDATE 2017-2018

Awards and Recognition

Fulbright Student Program Semifinalist

Senior Mairin Cotter was named a semifinalist in the Fulbright Student Program competition. The Fulbright U.S. Student Program provides grants or individually designed study/research projects or for English Teaching Assistant Programs. Mairin is a psychology major and is currently interviewing for research positions in several neuroscience labs.

Bellarmine Society

This spring, seniors Matthew Kondrat and Clare Hagan were selected as members of the inaugural Bellarmine Society. The Bellarmine Society is a diverse group of senior students who demonstrate committed service to Bellarmine University. Great Lakes Valley Conference Scholar-Athlete of the Year



Research

Kentucky Honors Roundtable

Six students attended the biannual Kentucky Honors Roundtable held at Morehead State University on February 23 and 24. Students presented their research in front of their peers and connected with other Honors students from across the state. The Kentucky Honors Roundtable is hosted on a rotating basis by Kentucky universities and will be hosted by Bellarmine University in spring 2019.

Southern Regional Honors Council Conference

From April 5-7, seven students attended the Southern Regional Honors Council Conference in Washington, D.C. SRHC is composed of over 100 colleges and universities from across the Southeastern United States. Students shared their thesis research in poster and presentation sessions over three days and had the opportunity to explore the city. Junior Eli Megibben also traveled to Washington to conduct research for her senior thesis at the United States Memorial Holocaust Museum.

Kentucky Biomedical Research Infrastructure Network

Last summer, junior Kandis Arlinghaus was accepted into the Kentucky Biomedical Research Infrastructure Network, a 10 week program for students interested in medical careers and biomedical research. Kandis presented her research on the effects of a zinc and fat controlled diet on autistic behaviors in mice at the Kentucky Academy of Science's conference in November, where she received 2nd place for her poster in the health sciences division.

Freshman Jordan Stacy was recently accepted to KBRIN's summer research internship program. The tenweek long summer program allows students to openly explore topics of their own interests in small teams while building important skills and scientific ways of thinking. Jordan will collaborate with his team to determine his research subject at the beginning of summer.

American Pain Society Scientific Summit

Last summer, Hailee Bray volunteered full time with the Kentucky Spinal Cord Injury Research Center. This year as a sophomore, Hailee has been working with faculty mentor Dr. Sonja Bareiss on a project entitled "New Mechanisms and Targeting of Maladaptive Sensory Growth in the Development of Neuropathic Pain Following Spinal Cord Injury." Hailee presented their research at the American Pain Society's Scientific Summit in Anaheim, CA this spring, and most notably, the abstract for this project was published in The Journal of Pain.

Research Experiences for Undergraduates (REU)

Junior Cat Terrell was awarded a Research Experiences for Undergraduates (REU) award through the National Science Foundation. Cat will work with Dr. Agnes Luo at the University of Cincinnati researching methods of therapy for stroke and other brain injury patients in order to expand the treatment window for brain injuries. Cat is a Biology major with a Biochemistry and Molecular Biology minor.

Infant Cognition Lab, University of Louisville

Last summer, Katie Kaufling volunteered part time in the University of Louisville's Infant Cognition Lab. She was able to strengthen her research skills while learning more about a graduate program she may attend after Bellarmine. Katie is a Psychology major with a Business Administration minor, and is currently serving as the Junior Representative on the Honors Student Advisory Board.

Study Abroad

The Honors program is able to offer a rotating selection of courses with travel abroad experiences to locations such as Italy, Belize, and Peru. Students in good standing in the program are eligible to receive funding for these courses to make them more affordable.

HONR-320: Rome: Crossroad of Religions

15 Honors students travelled to Rome, Italy, in December 2017 as part of Dr. Elizabeth Hinson-Hasty's HONR-320 Rome: Crossroads of Religions course. After studying the Eternal City throughout the fall semester, students traveled to Rome for one week during winter break. The group visited a number of religious and cultural sites while enjoying delicious local food and developing deeper friendships. HONR-320: History of Belize course

12 Honors students and faculty will travel to Belize between May 5-May 14 as part of the HONR-320 History of Belize course. Students will spend the second half of the spring semester examining Mayan/Belizean history, Belizean music, Belizean culture, Belizean/Central American economics and politics, and coral reef ecology. While in Belize, students will snorkel the second largest barrier reef in the world, interact with local Belizeans, learn firsthand about coral reef ecology, visit Mayan temples, and have many more exciting experiences.

Honors Students Abroad

A number of Bellarmine Honors students study abroad each year. Here are just a few examples of the places our students are visiting.

Sophomore Audrie Lamb studied abroad in Segovia for two weeks through the Kentucky Institute for International Studies (KIIS).
