In 1997, Hong Kong reverted from a British colony to China. While many predicted that Hong Kong would suffer from the transition and lose its separate identity, this has not happened. Hong Kong remains a vibrant economy in its own right and as a part of China. We will examine how China managed the transition and what lessons it holds for other emerging nations. We will focus on experiential, cross-cultural leaning and meet with government and business leaders from British, Hong Kong and Chinese communities, as well as private citizens and non-profit organizations, while immersing ourselves into everyday life in one of the most exciting parts of Asia.

This course is an inquiry into culture, the characteristics of culture, and intercultural awareness. Through this study abroad experience, students will engage in the local culture of Hong Kong and will examine topics such as individualistic and collectivist societies, Confucianism, food and culture, intercultural communication, education and culture, and the intersection of culture and globalization. These themes will be explored through excursions including, but nor limited to, visits to temples, the Hong Kong Heritage Museum, the Hong Kong Museum of History, local markets, the opportunity for a traditional Cantonese dining experience, visits to a local school, and a daytrip to Mainland China.
