DOMINICAN REPUBLIC FACTS

The Dominican Republic and Haiti share the island of Hispaniola, which is the second largest island in the Caribbean after Cuba. However, while the two countries may share the same island, their cultures are vastly different.

- ◆ Population: about 9,200,000
- ◆ Language: Spanish
- ◆ Government type: Representative Democracy
- ◆ Average annual income: \$6,500 annually per household
- ◆ 25% live below poverty
- ◆ Industries: tourism, exporting sugar, coffee, tobacco
- ◆ Year-round average temperature is 77°F
- ◆ Currency: the peso – fluctuates daily
- ◆ State Religion: Catholicism
