Advanced Placement Policy: Bellarmine University offers academic credit, placement, or both to students who earn scores of 4 or 5 (a few departments accept scores of 3) on the Advanced Placement tests sponsored by The College Board. This table is a complete listing of how credits will transfer. Credit will not be awarded for both AP and IB exams credit in the same subject. If you subsequently take a course at Bellarmine for which you received AP credit placement, you will not be awarded credit for that subsequent course; it would be considered a repeat. This information was last updated Fall 2017.
