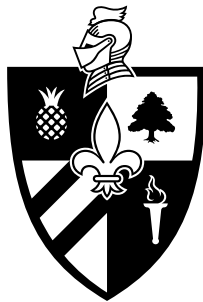

UNDERGRADUATE REGISTRATION

CURRENTLY ENROLLED STUDENTS

Web registration for the upcoming term is available for most undergraduate students who are currently enrolled. For more information on how to web register, refer to the Web Registration Procedures and Policies section on page 2. See below to determine your registration method based on your student type.

DEGREE-SEEKING STUDENTS

First-Time Bachelor's Degree Students

The majority of the undergraduate student population falls into this category; web registration is required for this population.

Post Baccalaureate Accelerated Nursing Students

Web registration is required for one-year track students registering for courses with the NURA prefix. An email will be sent to this population with their specific registration date and time.

Students in the two- or three-year track must register using an approved registration worksheet provided by the Nursing Department Chairperson. Web registration is not available for post baccalaureate students who need to register for nursing courses with the NURS prefix; prerequisite errors will prevent successful web registration for these courses. The Nursing department will coordinate the distribution and collection of registration worksheets and will submit them to the Registrar's Office for entry.

Post Baccalaureate Accounting Certificate Students

Web registration is available but optional. Advisor approval is required. Alternatively, students may use the Registration Worksheet found on the Registrar's Office website. Submit it to Dr. Richard Schrader, program advisor, for approval and registration.

All Other Post Baccalaureate Degree Students

Web registration is available but optional. Advisor approval is required. Alternatively, students may use the Registration Worksheet found on the Registrar's Office website (advisor's signature required).

NON-DEGREE STUDENTS

Returning International Exchange Students

Web registration is not available. Register directly with the International Programs Office (IPO) on the opening day of "junior" class registration. Contact the IPO for more information.

Metroversity Students

Web registration is not available. Approved Metroversity forms are required for registration. Refer to the academic calendar for registration date.

All Other Non-Degree Students

Web registration is not available. Students may use the Registration Worksheet found on the Registrar's Office website (advisor's signature is not required). Refer to the academic calendar for registration date. Note: If you are intending to enroll for the semester as a degree-seeking student, you must be admitted as such and will be registered as part of your admission process (see New or Readmitted Students section below).

NEW OR READMITTED STUDENTS

Undergraduate students who will be new to Bellarmine (non first-time freshmen) or who will be readmitted for the upcoming semester may register after current students, and after admission or readmission to the university. Course registration will be part of the admission or readmission process. Contact your admission counselor for details.

GRADUATE REGISTRATION

CURRENTLY ENROLLED STUDENTS

Web registration is required for students in some graduate programs. For more information on how to web register, refer to the Web Registration Procedures and Policies section on page 2. See below to determine your registration method based on your student type.

DEGREE-SEEKING STUDENTS

Students in these graduate degree programs are required to web register for classes using myBellarmine and should

seek advising and registration clearance from the person listed:

Master of Arts in Communication – Dr. Lara Needham

Master of Science in Taxation – Dr. Richard Schrader

Master of Science in Analytics – Ms. Theresa Carnes

Graduate Nursing and Health Science Students – Students' program advisor

Master of Business Administration – The MBA Office will grant registration clearance for all MBA students prior to the opening of registration. Contact that office directly with specific registration questions.

Doctor of Physical Therapy – Web registration is not available. Students will be registered by Dr. Patty Gillette working directly with the Registrar's Office.

Students in these graduate degree programs do not register themselves online:

Doctor of Physical Therapy – Students will be registered by Dr. Patty Gillette working directly with the Registrar's Office.

Master of Arts in Spirituality – Use the Registration Worksheet available on the Registrar's Office website for your Bellarmine courses. Use Metroversity forms to register for any LPTS courses. Submit all forms to Dr. Gregory Hillis for approval and registration.

Graduate Education (all programs) – Contact your program advisor for advising and registration procedures. Contact Ms. Tara Belcher in the School of Education for specific registration questions.

NON-DEGREE STUDENTS

Web registration is not available. Students may use the Registration Worksheet found on the Registrar's Office website (advisor's signature is not required). Refer to the academic calendar for registration date. Note: If you are intending to enroll for the semester as a degree-seeking student, you must be admitted as such and will be registered as part of your admission process (see New Students section below).

NEW STUDENTS

Graduate students who will be new to Bellarmine for the upcoming semester may register after current students, and after admission to the university. Registration for classes will be part of your admission process. Contact your admission counselor for details.

READMITTED/RE-STARTING STUDENTS

Graduate students who are returning to Bellarmine after being away for at least one semester are not eligible for

web registration. Contact your program advisor for readmission or re-entry and registration procedures.

GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

SPECIAL REGISTRATION APPROVALS

- **Forms Required** – Some classes require special forms to register and cannot be completed on the web (e.g. Internships, Independent Studies, Contract Courses, Metroversity courses). Forms for these are available at the Registrar's Office.
- **Overload Approval** – Students wishing to pursue a credit overload must obtain approval using the Credit Overload Form, available on the Registrar's Office website. A per credit tuition overload charge will apply; contact the Bursar's Office for amount.

AUTHORIZATION APPROVAL

- **Undergraduate Students** – An Authorization Form is available on the Registrar's Office website and can be used to seek approval to register for a class 1) that is closed 2) for which you are missing the prerequisite, 3) that has a registration restriction, or 4) has a slight overlap in time with another course. All procedural information is included on that form.
- **Graduate Students** – Graduate students seeking special registration approval may be authorized into a course only with permission of the graduate program director. He or she will contact the Registrar's Office directly on your behalf to request the authorization entry.

Bellarmine students visiting other Metroversity schools must complete a Metroversity registration form at Bellarmine and submit it to the host institution's Registrar's Office according to the registration schedule of that school but no later than Bellarmine's last day to add and drop courses.

Students from other Metroversity schools visiting Bellarmine must complete a Metroversity form at their home school and submit it to Bellarmine's Registrar's Office no sooner than August 3, 2015.

WEB REGISTRATION PROCEDURES & POLICIES

WEB REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

1. Prepare your course selections:

- a. Review the requirements for your degree in the Bellarmine University Catalog or other official documents given to you by your advisor.
- b. Review a copy of your unofficial transcript to refresh your memory about the classes you have already completed. Also, verify that credits from any other institutions have been recorded properly.
- c. Obtain a blank Registration Worksheet from the Registrar's Office website.
- d. Complete the worksheet by listing your first choice classes as well as any alternates. See FAQs on the Registrar's Office website for more information about alternates.

2. Determine your registration "Time Ticket"

Login to myBellarmine to view your registration "time ticket" assignment; this is the precise date and time that you may begin to register. Mark your calendar with this information so that you can plan to register

as close to the opening of your time ticket as reasonably possible. Time ticket assignments will be available to view on myBellarmine approximately two weeks before registration begins.

3. Check your Hold status

Check your hold status on mybellarmine. Allow plenty of time to take care of any holds that will prevent registration.

4. Obtain approval from your Advisor

Arrange an advising appointment with your advisor. Present your completed Registration Worksheet to your advisor for his/her approval. After your appointment, your advisor must complete two actions: 1) he/she must login to their own myBellarmine account and grant you registration clearance for the proper semester and 2) he/she must sign your registration worksheet. Web registration will not work without electronic clearance granted by your advisor. The signature on the registration worksheet will serve as proof of your advisor's approval in the event that you need help from the Registrar's Office.

Note for graduate MBA students: You will not complete the advising and registration worksheet process and will automatically be pre-cleared for registration.

5. Register for classes

- a. When your time ticket opens, login to myBellarmine and either click the direct link to registration found in the Registrar's Office Announcements box on the home page, or click the Student Tab and then open the Registrar's Office folder and select Course Registration.
- b. Next, click the Add/Drop Courses link to begin the registration process. Remember to enter the correct Term and Program for registration. Have your registration worksheet with you when you register; it will help remind you what your advisor has approved and will also facilitate the entry of your course selections into the registration screen.
- c. See Web Registration Tips on the Registrar's Office website for more information about navigating inside the registration system.

6. Print a copy of your Class Schedule

If you wish, print a copy of your schedule for your records. Your advisor will automatically receive a

copy of your schedule via email. If your registration is complete and you do not need further assistance, keep your signed worksheet for your reference; you do not need to turn it in.

7. Need additional help?

- a. Check the Frequently Asked Questions link on the Registrar's Office website.

WEB REGISTRATION POLICIES

1. Time Ticket Policies

- a. Students register by classification as outlined on the academic calendar. Seniors are defined as 90 or more completed credits, juniors have completed 60-89 credits, sophomores have completed 30-59 credits, and freshmen have less than 30 completed credits.
- b. Within each classification, students are assigned a specific time ticket. The time ticket is the precise date and time that registration opens for each individual student.
- c. Time ticket assignment is done in order to control the volume of traffic on the myBellarmine server. Time tickets assign students to reasonably sized groups that can be handled by the server.
- d. Time tickets are assigned by a randomly generated computer program.
- e. Students whose time tickets open while in class are strongly advised to wait until after class to register. Instructors are not obligated to honor registration as a valid excused absence.
- f. Students who think their time ticket should be assigned to a higher classification should check the number of cumulative earned credits on their Bellarmine transcript. For further questions, contact the Registrar's Office

2. Priority Registration Policy

- a. Due to the structured nature of their programs, ROTC students and Bellarmine University student-athletes qualify for priority registration. Eligible

students will be assigned a registration time ticket that opens in the late afternoon the day prior to their normal class standing's registration period. For example, an eligible (defined in b and c below) sophomore will be allowed to register during the final time ticket on the last day of junior registration.

- b. **ROTC Students:** To be eligible for priority registration, ROTC students must be officially registered for Bellarmine credit in at least one ROTC course in the current semester (typically shown as M.S. prefixed courses on their course schedule). Students must also have documented information accessible to the Registrar's Office indicating their continuation of the program in the upcoming semester. Such documentation would only be necessary if the ROTC student does not meet the ROTC course registration requirement. ROTC students will have priority registration in both fall and spring semester.
- c. **Bellarmine University NCAA Student-Athletes:** Student-athletes will be granted priority registration for the semester of their traditional season(s) of competition. To be eligible, students-athletes must be listed on the official Bellarmine University NCAA sanctioned roster of their sport. Sports that qualify are listed below.
 - During the fall, when registering for spring classes, priority registration will take place for student-athletes in the following sports: baseball, softball, lacrosse, men's tennis, women's tennis, men's track & field, and women's track & field.
 - During the spring, when registering for fall classes, priority registration will take place for student-athletes in the following sports: field hockey, volleyball, men's cross country, women's cross country, men's soccer, and women's soccer.
 - Due to competition schedules that overlap terms, athletes in the following sports will have priority registration for both fall and spring semesters: men's golf, women's golf, men's basketball, women's basketball, men's swimming and women's swimming.

3. Advisor Approval Policies

- a. Students must have advisor approval to register. The electronic version of advisor approval is when he or she grants "registration clearance". Students must obtain electronic clearance only from their

official advisor. Students must contact their advisor directly if clearance has not been granted.

- b. Advisor information can be viewed by students on myBellarmine. Only the student's official assigned advisor can grant registration clearance. For questions about advisors, contact the Academic Resource Center (ARC) at 502.272.7400.
- c. Students are strongly encouraged to obtain their advisor's signature on their registration worksheet. In the event that registration assistance is needed, the Registrar's Office will require proof of the advisor's approval; this signature will provide that proof.
- d. Students with more than one official advisor may go to either advisor for electronic clearance and a signature on the worksheet.
- e. If extenuating circumstances prevent a student from obtaining advisor approval (electronic clearance or signed worksheet), he/she may request a signature on the registration worksheet from the department chair of their major, the academic dean of their school, or a professional advisor in the ARC. Approval from any of these parties is at their discretion. Once a signature is obtained on the worksheet, the student may bring it to the Registrar's Office for assistance. The Registrar's Office will only register students with a valid signature.

4. Registration Changes

- a. Once a student's time ticket is open, it will remain open through the day before the semester begins. This will allow students to make any necessary changes to their own schedule up until the add/drop begins.
- b. Changes made by students will automatically be emailed to their advisor. Advisors do not need to approve changes, but students are strongly encouraged to discuss any changes with them in advance. Students must accept responsibility for any registration changes made without advisor consultation.
- c. Once the semester begins, students have one week to add/drop classes. During this week all add/drops must be done in person at the Registrar's Office.

TUITION & FEE INFORMATION

Full-Time Undergraduate Students – More than eleven (11) and no greater than nineteen (19) credits = \$18,105 per semester. More than nineteen (19) credits (petition required) = \$850 per credit hour for credits in excess of 19.

Part-Time Undergraduate Students – Eleven (11) credits or less = \$850 per credit hour. Audit Students = 1/3 tuition.
Graduate Students – Varies by program.

TUITION PAYMENT PLAN

Information on payment plan options may be obtained from the Bursar's Office, Room HORR210.

TUITION AND FEES DEADLINE

Undergraduate students are expected to enter into and begin making payments on an installment plan or pay in full the estimated amount due by August 3, 2015.

Graduate students are expected to pay in full by September 23, 2015, or enter into a payment arrangement that is described on the tuition contract.

Students who do not pay their tuition and fees or select a payment plan by this deadline will be subject to interest charges. Delinquent accounts are charged a 1.5% finance charge monthly or 18% annually. Bellarmine University reserves the right to cancel registrations due to delinquent tuition payments unless special arrangements have been made with the Bursar's Office. Cancellation does not remove responsibility for payment. In the event of default, the university may notify credit reporting agencies, a collection agency, and/or bring a legal action to recover payment, interest and collection fees. You agree to reimburse us the fees of any collection agency which may be based on a percentage at a maximum of 33% of the debt, and all costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs, without limitation, that we incur in such collection efforts. SEMESTER TUITION REFUND SCHEDULE

Schedules differ for a complete withdrawal from the university versus dropping and adding individual classes. Fees are not refundable after August 19, 2015. Tuition refunds for alternative start dates will be pro-rated. Contact the Bursar at bursar@bellarmine.edu or 502.272.8264 with questions.

COMPLETE WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY

August 19 – Last day for 100% refund

August 26 – Last day for 80% tuition refund

September 30 – Last day for 50% tuition refund

ADJUSTING CLASSES WITHIN THE UNIVERSITY (DROP/ADD)

August 26 – Last day individual classes can be added/dropped with full tuition refund // Last day to change from full-time to part-time status with full tuition refund

September 30 – Last day for 50% tuition refund

WITHDRAWAL POLICY

Students who find it necessary to drop a course(s) or to withdraw completely from the university must provide written notification to the Office of the Registrar. The effective date of withdrawal is the date on which the notification is received in the Registrar's Office. This date is used in calculating any applicable tuition reduction/refund.

When a student officially withdraws from the university or from any course(s), charges will be adjusted according to the refund schedule published for each term. The full amount of tuition will be due unless the withdrawal occurs during the refund period; all fees are non-refundable. Also, refer to the "Adjustments & Refunds of Tuition" section in the University Course Catalog.

WITHDRAWAL FROM A SINGLE COURSE(S)

Students may drop a course during the first week of classes (fall and spring) with no entry on their official transcript. The deadlines for dropping summer courses are published in the summer academic calendar. To drop a course, a completed drop card must be submitted to the Registrar's Office. No signatures are required on the drop card.

From the second through approximately the tenth week of classes (or two-thirds of the semester for classes not offered on a regular semester basis), students may withdraw from a course and a grade of W will be recorded on the transcript. Withdraw cards are available in the Registrar's Office and require the signature of the course instructor. Students may not withdraw from a course after the withdrawal deadline published in the semester's academic calendar. To withdraw after the deadline, students must follow the Waiver/Exceptions Policy outlined in the catalog.

WITHDRAWAL FROM THE ENTIRE SEMESTER

Non-medical Withdrawal

To withdraw from all courses in the semester, all students must complete a Withdrawal Form found on the Registrar's Office website (individual withdrawal cards may not be submitted). Students should be aware of the refund policies and any financial aid implications of a withdrawal. Students who fail to comply with this policy will receive an F for all courses for which they are registered and will be responsible for corresponding tuition and fees. Students may not withdraw from the semester after the withdrawal deadline published in the semester's academic calendar. To withdraw after the deadline, students must follow the Waiver/Exceptions Policy outlined in the catalog. All full-time undergraduate students are required to meet with, and obtain the signature of, a representative of the Academic Resource Center (ARC) prior to withdrawing.

Medical Withdrawal

Enrolled students who become incapacitated by serious illness or injury, whether mental or physical, and find it necessary to withdraw from all classes at the university, must submit a request using the Withdrawal Form and have it signed by the Dean of Students or that person's designee. The student may be entitled to a tuition adjustment once the appropriate documents, such as a letter from the student's physician describing the illness or injury, along with any supporting documents, such as proof of a hospital stay, and the Tuition Appeal Form are provided to the Bursar. The Tuition Appeal Form may be obtained by contacting the Bursar's Office directly. The supporting documentation may be submitted after the submission of the Withdrawal Form, but it must be submitted prior to the end of the current semester. Any financial aid will be adjusted according to the Title IV and Institutional Refund policies. All fees are non-refundable.

Military Service Withdrawal

Students enrolled in courses at the university at the time they are called for active military service, and find it necessary to withdraw from all classes at the university, must submit the Withdrawal Form to the Registrar's Office. The student will have their tuition and fees reversed once the appropriate documents, such as the military orders, and the Tuition Appeal Form are provided to the Bursar. The Tuition Appeal Form may be obtained by contacting the Bursar's Office directly. The supporting documentation may be submitted after the submission of the Withdrawal Form, but it must be submitted prior to the end of the cur-

rent semester. Any financial aid will be adjusted according to the Title IV and Institutional Refund policies.

INSTITUTIONAL FINANCIAL AID REFUND POLICY AFTER WITHDRAWAL

When a student has institutional financial aid from Bellarmine University and completely withdraws during the time that a tuition refund is due, the student is eligible to keep the same percentage of institutional financial aid that they are charged for tuition. The remaining aid is refunded to the financial aid programs.

Treatment of Federal Title IV Aid After Withdrawal

The law specifies how Bellarmine University must determine the amount of Federal Title IV program assistance that you earn if you withdraw from school. The Title IV programs that are covered by this law are Federal Pell Grants, Iraq/Afghanistan Service Grant, Direct Loans, Direct PLUS Loans, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (FSEOGs), Federal Perkins Loans, and TEACH Grants. Though your aid is posted to your account at the start of each semester, you earn the funds as you complete the semester. If you withdraw during the semester, the amount of Title IV program assistance that you have earned up to that point is determined by a specific formula. If you received (or Bellarmine or your parent received on your behalf) less assistance than the amount that you earned, you may be able to receive those additional funds. If you receive more assistance than you earned, the excess funds must be returned by Bellarmine and/or you.

The amount of assistance that you have earned is determined on a pro-rata basis. For example, if you completed 30% of your semester, you earn 30% of the assistance you were originally scheduled to receive. Once you have completed more than 60% of the semester, you earn all of the assistance that you were scheduled to receive for that semester. If you did not receive all of the funds that you earned, you may be due a post-withdrawal disbursement. If your post-withdrawal disbursement includes loan funds, Bellarmine must get your permission before it can disburse them. You may choose to decline some or all of your loan funds so that you don't incur additional debt. Bellarmine may automatically use all or a portion of your post-withdrawal disbursement of grant funds for tuition, fees, and room and board charges. Bellarmine needs your permission to use the post-withdrawal grant disbursement for all other school charges. If you do not give your permission, you will be offered the funds. However, it may be

in your best interest to allow Bellarmine to keep the funds to reduce your debt.

If you receive (or Bellarmine or your parent receives on your behalf) excess Title IV program funds that must be returned, Bellarmine must return a portion of the excess equal to the lesser of: 1. Your institutional charges multiplied by the unearned percentage of your funds, or 2. The entire amount of excess funds. Bellarmine must return this amount even if it didn't keep this amount of your Title IV program funds. If Bellarmine is not required to return all of the excess funds, you must return the remaining amount. Any loan funds that you must return, you (or your parent for a Direct PLUS Loan) repay in accordance with the terms of the promissory note. That is, you make scheduled payments to the holder of the loan over a period of time. Any amount of unearned grant funds that you must return is called an overpayment. The maximum amount of a grant overpayment that you must repay is half of the grant funds you received or were scheduled to receive. You do not have to repay a grant overpayment if the original amount of the overpayment is \$50 or less. Bellarmine will return the unearned grant funds for you, which may cause you to owe a balance. The requirements for Title IV program funds when you withdraw are separate from any refund policy that Bellarmine has. Therefore, you may still owe funds to Bellarmine to cover unpaid institutional charges. Bellarmine may also charge you for any Title IV program funds that Bellarmine was required to return. If you don't already know Bellarmine's refund policy, you can ask for a copy in the Office of the Registrar. Bellarmine can also provide you with the requirements and procedures for officially withdrawing from school. If you have questions about your Title IV program funds, you can call the Federal Student Aid Information Center at 1.800.4.FED.AID (1-800-433-3243). TTY users may call 1.800.730.8913. Information is also available on "Student Aid on the Web" at www.studentaid.ed.gov. The Office of Financial Aid and the Bursar at Bellarmine are also available to assist you.

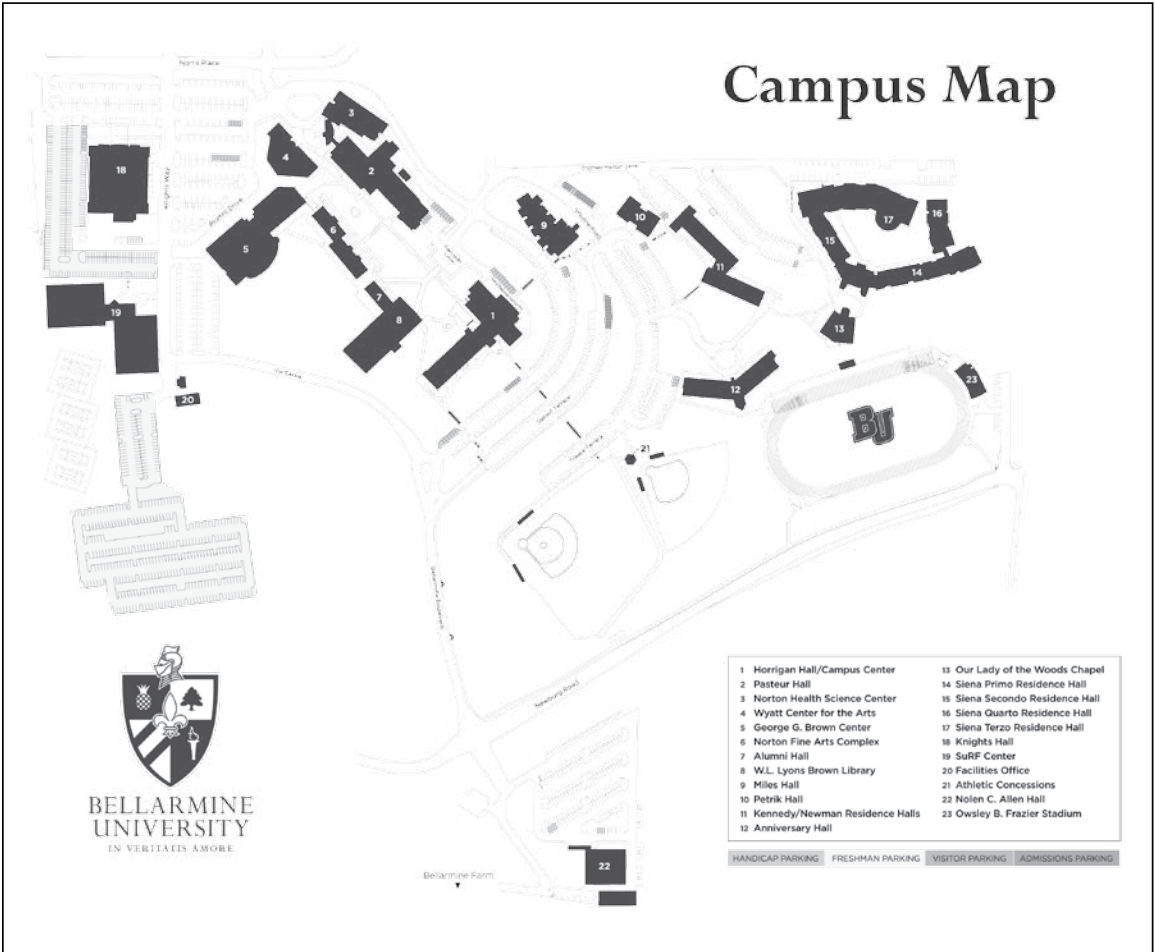

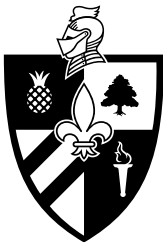
