

CORNELL CRAIG TO BE INDUCTED INTO SIU'S HALL OF FAME

Bellarmine University Director of Minority Programs (and Staff Council member) Cornell Craig will be inducted into Southern Illinois University's Hall of Fame in a ceremony on Feb. 29.

Craig was wide receiver on the Salukis football team from 1996-99 and holds numerous career receiving records at Southern Illinois, including most receptions (207), most receiving yards (3,508) and most touchdown catches (37). He had a phenomenal senior season, in which he caught 77 passes for 1,419 yards and 15 touchdowns, earning him national recognition as the Division I-AA Player of the Year.

Craig also holds the school record for catches in a game (13) and receiving yards in a game (219). He was an All-American in 1999 and a threetime all-conference honoree (1997-99).
