- You may test your college aptitude and start getting oriented to college challenges now.

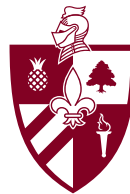

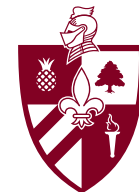

ACES is a dual credit program - a unique, three way partnership in academic excellence involving Bellarmine University faculty, talented high school students, and exemplary high school teachers.

Eligible high school students can earn college credit through the Bellarmine ACES courses that are taught right in their high schools.

Courses are rigorous and correspond to the equivalent freshman and sophomore Bellarmine classes.

Eligible students register for college credit through the Bellarmine ACES program.

WHO BENEFITS?

- Students, parents, and teachers all benefit from the ACES affiliation between Bellarmine University and the partner high schools.
- ACES students begin their path to college at a reduced cost and earn college credit with grade points that will be listed on a Bellarmine University transcript.
- ACES also makes the college transition easier, making students better prepared for full-time college coursework.

WHAT IS THE COST?

- Tuition for the 2009-2010 school year is \$105 per credit hour. A three-credit class costs \$315 and a four-credit class costs \$420.
- ACES tuition is discounted 84% from regular Bellarmine University tuition.
- A limited number of scholarships are available for students receiving free or reduced lunch. Contact the ACES Director for more information.

WILL THE CREDITS TRANSFER?

- Bellarmine University is fully credited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS).
- ACES credit is Bellarmine University credit that is listed on a Bellarmine University transcript.
- Although many colleges and universities, both public and private, accept Bellarmine University credits without reservation, there are schools that may not accept the credit or place restrictions on applications toward degree requirements.
- It is the student's responsibility to check the transferability of the ACES course with the Registrar's Office at the university or college he/she is interested in before registering for ACES courses.
- Bellarmine University transcripts may be sent to other colleges or universities to transfer credit. Email the Registrar's Office at registrar@bellarmine.edu to make arrangements.

IMPORTANT ACADEMIC POLICIES

Students, parents and teachers should be aware of these important policies:

- A student is restricted to no more than two 100-level courses in a single discipline during his/her junior and senior years of high school (ex. Acct. 101 & 102).
- College credit is earned only if a student achieves a "B-" final grade or higher. The grade earned becomes part of the student's official college transcript at Bellarmine University. No tuition refunds are granted.

WHAT ARE THE CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION?

ACES acceptance and enrollment into the program is based on academic achievement. Students who meet the following eligibility criteria may apply for admission:

- Student must be enrolled in a college preparatory curriculum.
- Student must have earned a minimum cumulative high school GPA of 3.25.
- Student must have a minimum composite ACT score of 23 OR a combined math and critical reading score of 1080 on the SAT.
- The ACES liaison at each partner school must verify the student's academic record by signing the registration card.
- Student must submit the registration card with both instructor and liaison signatures and will not be permitted to register without required signatures.

HOW DO I REGISTER?

- Complete the attached registration card.
- Refer to the course schedule for your school to obtain the correct course NAME, course NUMBER, and credit hours (ex. Comm. 103 AB 3).
- Each instructor, as well as school liaison, must sign the registration card.
- **Fall Registration Deadline: Friday, September 18, 2009. Postmark for Fall Registration: Monday, September 14, 2009**
- **Spring Registration Deadline: Friday, February 12, 2010. Postmark for Spring Registration: Monday, February 8, 2010.**
