PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION

M.A. in Spirituality Theology Department Bellarmino University

All applicants must submit the following:

- a. A completed graduate application form.
- b. A non-refundable application fee of \$25.00. (Make check payable to 'Bellarmino University')
- c. Official college transcripts of ALL graduate and undergraduate credits from accredited institutions.
- d. Three (3) letters of recommendation: two letters of recommendation from academic references; and one letter of recommendation from a pastoral reference or from a peer-in-ministry reference.
- e. A Spiritual Autobiography. (*See attached essay for a suggested method for writing your Spiritual Autobiography*). This typewritten (double-spaced) essay should be 8-10 pages in length. Each applicant will write a unique and personal essay to articulate the applicant's reflections on spirituality. The essay does not require or expect you to do research; you are not encouraged to posture or to imitate classic spiritual autobiographies.

A Spiritual Autobiography might include such topics as:

- What has been your most fulfilling experience in life, and why do you reverence it?
- What has been the most difficult hurdle in your life, and how did you work through it?
- Who have been important mentors in your spiritual growth, and what did they teach you?
