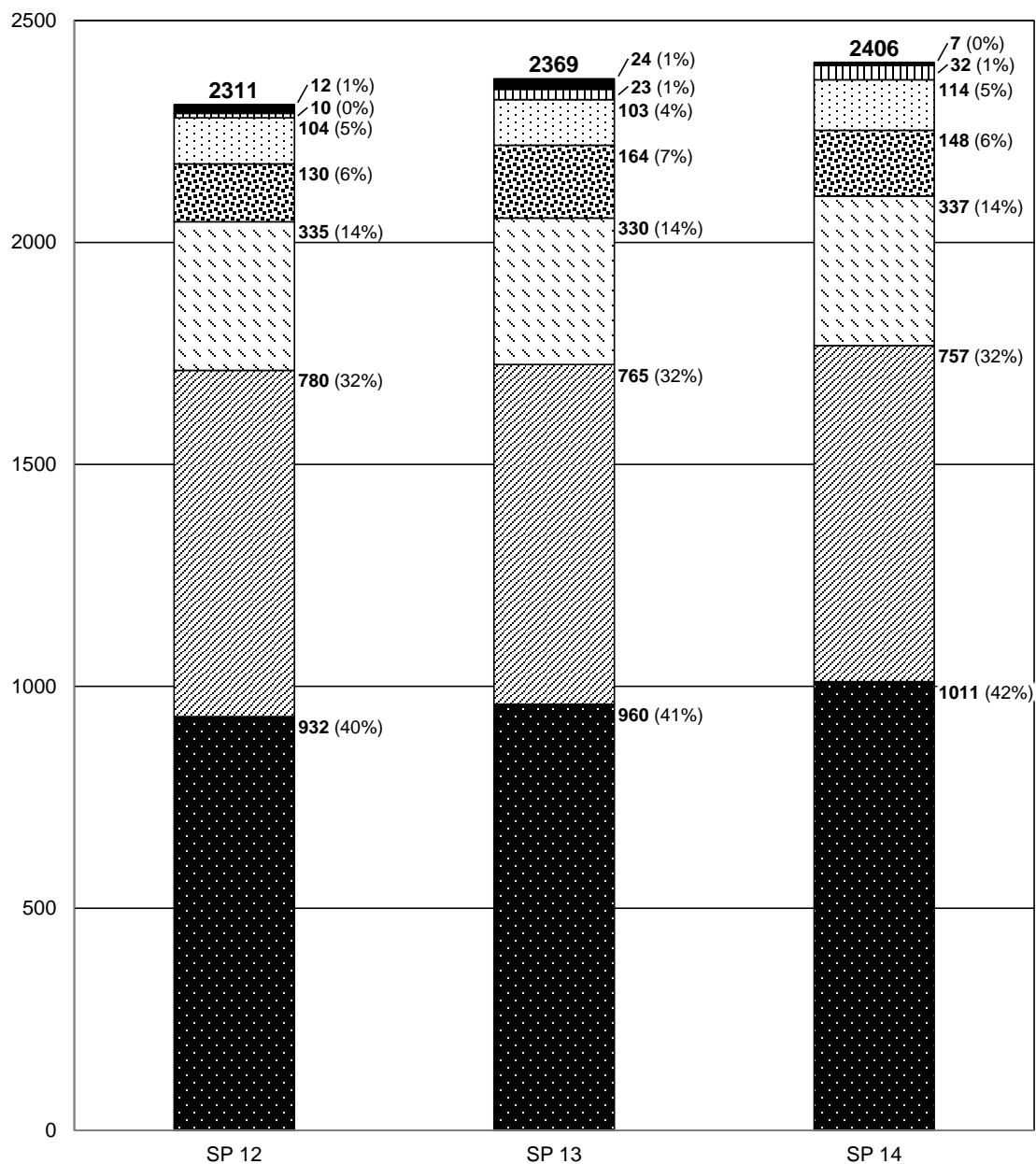

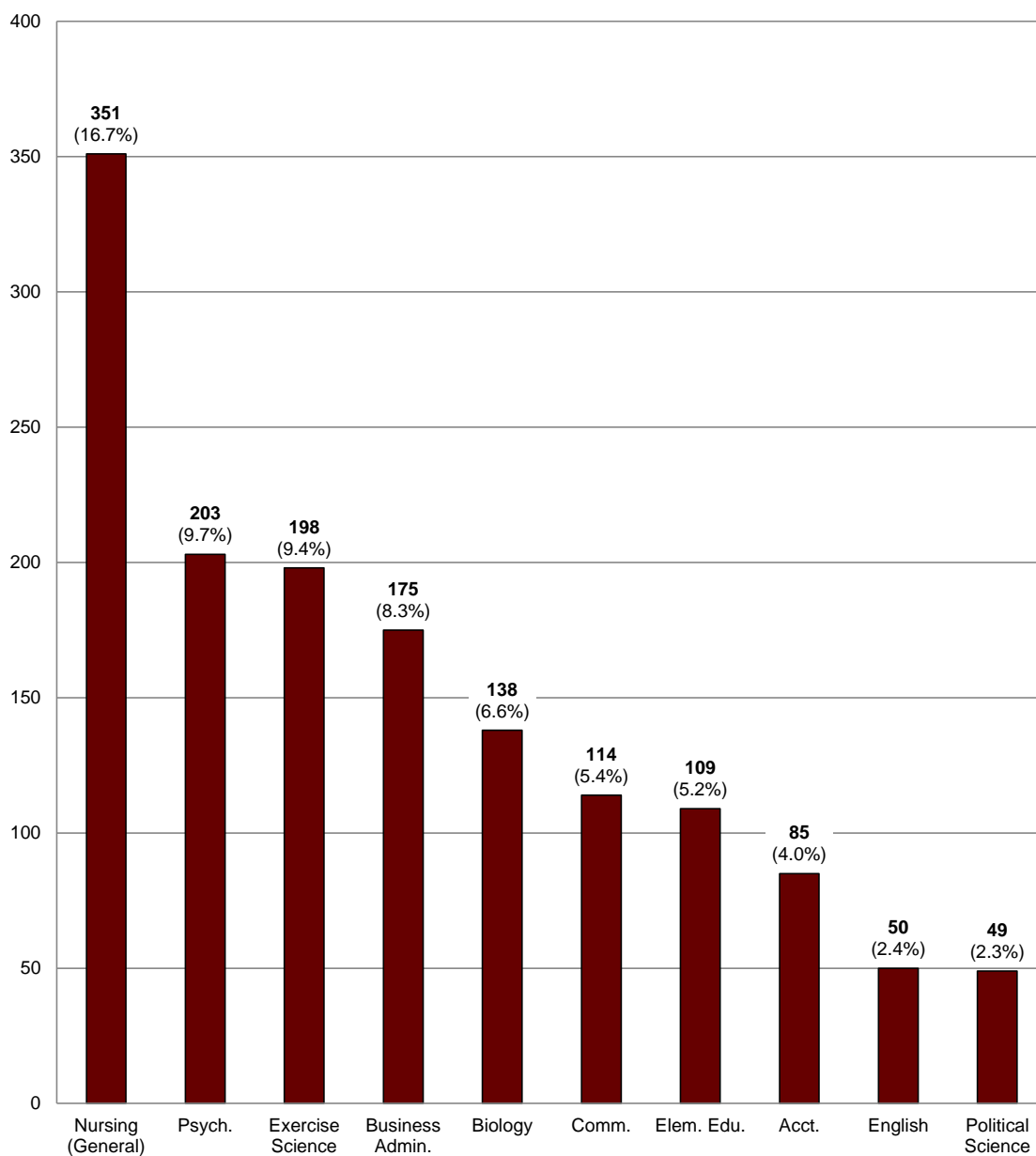

## Appendix

### Undergraduate Notes

1. All counts shown in the table above represent official census, unduplicated headcounts using the IPEDS standard.
2. Transfers and readmitted students are included in class counts on the basis of earned credit hours.
3. High School students who were enrolled in the ACES Program are not included in this report.
4. *Fr*: Freshmen students (including first-time students) are those with less than 30 cumulative earned hours.
5. *So*: Sophomore students are those with more than 30 cumulative earned hours but less than 60.
6. *Jr*: Junior students are those with more than 60 cumulative earned hours but less than 90.
7. *Sr*: Senior students are those with more than 90 cumulative earned hours.
8. *Pb*: Postbaccalaureate
9. *Cert*: Certificate
10. *N.D.*: Non-Degree
11. Undecided and non-degree students are counted in Bellarmine College (Arts & Sciences) unless they have an affiliation with a specific BU School (e.g., non-degree Lansing students are designated UNDL and counted towards the Lansing School numbers).
12. Before FA 11, secondary education was offered as a minor only. Counts for secondary education minors:
  - SP 14*: 5
  - SP 13*: 13
  - SP 12*: 24
13. Medical Lab. Science Certificate (CMDL) is only offered to visiting students from IU Southeast.
14. The Applied Information Technology bachelor's program is no longer accepting new students.

16. Prior to SP 14, MLIT (Literacy) was coded as MRDG (Reading and Writing).
