President's Update – April 2008

Dear Bellarmine Students, Faculty and Staff,

Last week's on-site SACS visit for reaffirmation of accreditation was a great triumph for the university! The SACS committee was clearly impressed by the extraordinary enthusiasm they experienced in their interactions with faculty, staff, students and trustees on campus, and they said the enthusiasm was contagious.

I am delighted to report that the on-site committee was very impressed with our Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP), Liberal Education in an International Context: Preparing Students for a Globally Competitive World. The committee said they were impressed that "you have come together as a community and constructed a thoughtful, important, valuable plan – and you have done so with genuine enthusiasm – mindful of Vision 2020, of your Catholic Identity in the spirit of Thomas Merton, and of your mission."

The committee's major recommendations for Bellarmine had to do with clarifying documentation of our assessment of institutional effectiveness, including the QEP, and clarifying the process to document faculty credentials in the IDC program. Over the next five months as part of the process we will respond to these recommendations.

I wish in particular to thank Dr. Doris Tegart, Dr. Carole Pfeffer and Ms. Beth Davis, and all of the Bellarmine SACS and QEP teams for their tremendously effective effort in coordinating our SACS work, and everyone else involved, for what has proven to be a very valuable and positive experience for Bellarmine University. I also wish to acknowledge the organizational efforts early on of the SACS and QEP work by Dean Rob Kingsolver, and especially recognize Professor Gabriele Bosley, who was also instrumental in the QEP design and development. Her excellent work in Internationalization significantly informed our QEP proposal.

Fontana di Verita

Bellarmine's gorgeous new landmark, the Fountain of Truth -- in the plaza between Our Lady of the Woods Chapel and Siena Primo, is nearing completion and will be dedicated in April. Formally known as Fontana di Verita at Piazza Clayton, the scheduled completion date is April 18.

The fountain will be a black granite wall 65 feet long and six and a half feet tall, engraved with our university's Latin motto, In Veritatis Amore (In the love of truth). A sheet of water will cascade over the face of the wall into a basin and continuously recycle. We are planning to dedicate Fontana di Verita after our Board of Trustees meeting on April 23.

Hughes Selected For McGowan Prize For Faculty Development

Dr. Claire E. Hughes is the winner of the first inaugural Joseph and Maureen McGowan Prize for Faculty Development, for the summer of 2008. The prize is designed to help increase international experiences for Bellarmine faculty and provides the winner with an opportunity to research at the University of Oxford's Harris-Manchester College Summer Institute.

Dr. Hughes is an accomplished teacher, researcher, and scholar in the field of special education. Her knowledge of inclusive teaching strategies and language acquisition has provided Bellarmine and the Louisville community with added expertise on strategies for teaching children. She will be focusing on teaching children with autism, an emerging area of research in education. She is published in highly regarded journals and is working on a book for educators who work with autistic students. She intends to spend much of her week at Harris Manchester College writing this book.

The McGowan Prize will also allow Dr. Hughes the chance to engage with leading researchers in the field of autism. In turn, her contributions to this growing field of study will further assist the School of Education in meeting the goals of Vision 2020."

Miles Hall Expansion

We've begun the construction of an addition to Miles Hall. We will be adding three floors of space to include two large classrooms, two midsize classrooms and eleven new faculty offices. The expansion will be completed in time for the spring 09 semester.
