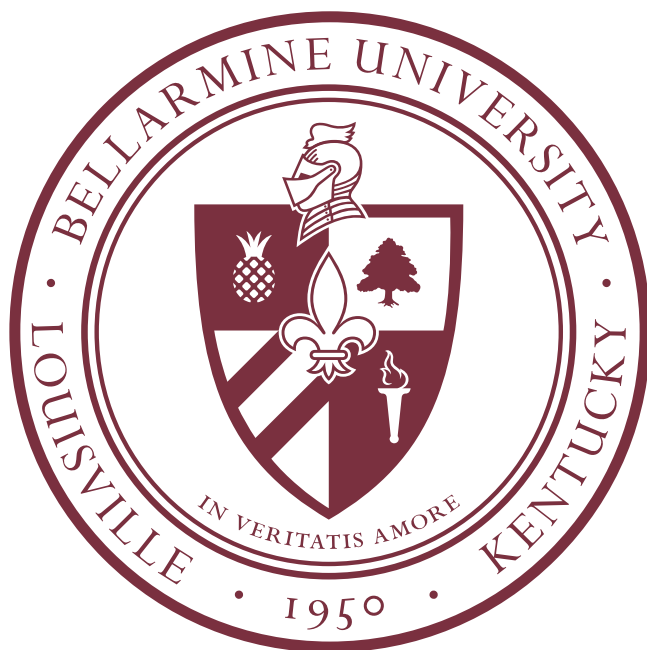

HISTORY & TRADITION

Bellarmino University opened on October 3, 1950, under the sponsorship of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Louisville and with the special assistance of the Conventual Franciscan Fathers. Bellarmine was one of the first schools in the Commonwealth of Kentucky open to all races. The first 42 graduating seniors, “The Pioneer Class,” received their diplomas in 1954.

In 1968, Bellarmine merged with Ursuline College, a Catholic college for women established by the Ursuline Sisters of Louisville in 1938. The merger created a coeducational student body, and Bellarmine became independent with a self-perpetuating governing board. In 2000, the Board of Trustees voted to change the name of the institution from Bellarmine College to Bellarmine University to reflect its true status as a comprehensive master’s institution.

Bellarmino University is made up of the Bellarmine College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Health Professions (including the Donna and Allan Lansing School of Nursing and Clinical Sciences and the School of Movement and Rehabilitation Sciences), the W. Fielding Rubel School of Business, the Annisley Frazier Thornton School of Education, and the School of Continuing and Professional Studies. Bellarmine offered its first graduate program, the Master of Business Administration, in 1975. Today, Bellarmine offers numerous graduate and doctoral programs in business, communication, education and healthcare.

Bellarmino University is situated on approximately 175 acres of gently rolling terrain that slopes down to Louisville’s historic Beargrass Creek. The campus currently consists of more than 40 buildings encompassing nearly 1 million square feet of space. Many of Bellarmine’s buildings—most notably Our Lady of the Woods Chapel, W.L. Lyons Brown Library, Anniversary Hall, Norton Health Science Center and the Siena residence hall complex—are recognized for their outstanding architecture.

Bellarmino University was founded in the rich tradition of Catholic education. This tradition emphasizes academic excellence, encourages a vigorous intellectual climate which affirms the compatibility of faith and reason, and nurtures a campus culture and community which reflect basic Judeo-Christian values including concern for each individual as a whole person and service to others. As the premier independent Catholic university in the South, Bellarmine remains firmly grounded in its mission to prepare students to make a living and a life worth living.

BELLARMINE DEGREES

Bellarmino University offers doctoral degrees in Education, Leadership in Higher Education, Education and Social Change, Physical Therapy, Nursing Practice, and Health Professions Education; an Educational Specialist Degree in Instructional Leadership and School Administration; master’s degrees in Athletic Training, Business Administration, Communication, Digital Media, Education, Health Science, Nursing, and Teaching; Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Health Science, Bachelor of Music, Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Science in Nursing. The requirements for these degrees reflect the university’s emphasis on the liberal arts.

HISTORY & TRADITION

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Bellarmino University graduates wear academic regalia in the time-honored traditions of higher learning. The bachelor's gown has a closed front and long, pointed open sleeves hanging nearly to the knees. These gowns are traceable to an ancient monastic choir garb known as the cuculla. The doctorate and master's gowns have an opening at the level of the wrist to free the hands. The portion of the sleeve below the opening is straight at the back and has, in front, a long semi-circular cut-out.

Symbolic of the degree is the academic hood made of the same material as the gown. The master's hood is 42 inches in length with a three-inch velvet border. Doctor's degree hoods are four feet in length and have side panels that create a three-dimensional effect. The hood is silk-lined in the colors of the institution: scarlet and silver. The color of the velvet strip indicates the field of study in which the degree was earned. Bellarmino hoods are trimmed in golden yellow of science, apricot of nursing, light blue of education, drab of business administration, sage of physical therapy, crimson of communication and royal blue of philosophy.

The appropriate cap for all degrees is the familiar head piece known as the mortar board. It is adorned with a tassel worn hanging to the left of the face.

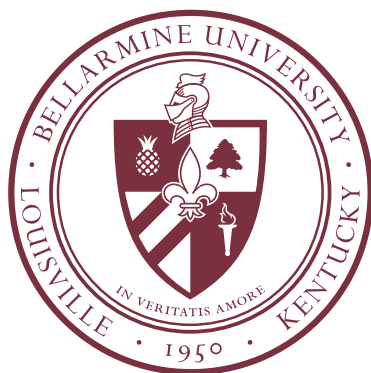
In addition to their academic regalia, graduates who have achieved special honors or distinctions may wear sashes, cords or medallions that signify their accomplishments.

LATIN HONORS

Undergraduate students who have earned Latin Honors are distinguished by the medallions worn at the front of their gowns.

A medallion with a scarlet ribbon represents a *Cum Laude* (GPA 3.50-3.69) graduate. A medallion with a silver ribbon represents a *Magna Cum Laude* (GPA 3.70-3.84) graduate. A medallion with a gold ribbon represents a *Summa Cum Laude* (GPA 3.85-4.00) graduate.

THE BELLARMINE SEAL



Bellarmino's official seal consists of the coat of arms and university motto framed within three circles, the band of which states the institution's name, Bellarmine University; location, Louisville, Kentucky; and founding date, 1950.

The shield has four quadrants created by a cross, emblematic of the university's founding in 1950 by the Archdiocese of Louisville in the distinguished Catholic tradition of higher education, the oldest continuing tradition of higher education in the history of the western world. Bellarmine continues to be inspired by the excellent values in its founding Catholic tradition, in the inclusive spirit of Thomas Merton.

The coat of arms contains several symbols. The **PINEAPPLE** is the traditional symbol of hospitality.

The **STRIPES** represent five important values in the Catholic tradition and the Bellarmine educational experience: the intrinsic dignity and value of every human being; our responsibility to educate the whole person—mind, body, heart and soul; the mystery, interconnectedness and ongoing nature of God's creation and "the hidden wholeness of things"; the importance of both faith and reason as ways of seeking the truth; and the call to each of us to develop our gifts and abilities to the fullest to give glory to God, serve those in need and make the world a better place.

The **FLEUR DE LIS** is the emblem of the city of Louisville.

The Bellarmine motto is *IN VERITATIS AMORE*, "In the love of truth."

At the top center of the shield appears the **HELMET** of the Bellarmine Knight mascot, established by founding President Alfred Horrigan, who was enchanted with the Arthurian legend and the quest for the Holy Grail.

The **URSULA LAUREL TREE**, from the Ursuline College coat of arms, symbolizes Bellarmine's participation in the legendary Ursuline education tradition (the schools merged in 1968).

The **TORCH** represents the light of truth and love.

THE UNIVERSITY MACE

Bellarmino, the academic mace of Bellarmine University, symbolizes the office and the authority of the President of the University, and descends from regal scepters and medieval battle maces. In academic procession, the mace is carried before the President.

Bellarmino University Board of Trustees Chair Emeritus Owsley Brown Frazier commissioned Louisville artist Scott Boyer to design a new mace to celebrate the university's new name and seal.

The mace represents a diploma scroll, formed into a torch of light, a traditional symbol of the illuminating power of education as it casts out the darkness of ignorance with the light of truth and knowledge.

Prominent on the mace is the official seal of Bellarmine University.

The heart of the mace houses a Celtic cross, symbolizing the Catholic origin and institutional identity of Bellarmine University. Near the cross appears an Ursula Laurel tree, the symbol of the Ursuline Sisters and Ursuline College which merged with Bellarmine in 1968, bringing the university into the Ursuline tradition of teaching excellence in Catholic higher education.

At the very top of the rolled scroll appear fleurs de lis, the symbol of the great City of Louisville, proud home of Bellarmine University. Finally, at the base of the torch is a representation of a pineapple, the traditional symbol of hospitality and in this case, of the legendary hospitality of the House of the university's patron saint, Cardinal Robert Bellarmine, S.J., and therefore of Bellarmine University itself.

The mace is 36 inches long and weighs 8 lbs. Its artistic beauty is enhanced by gold plating over cast aluminum.

CITATION FOR HONORARY DEGREE MICHAEL J. STONE '70



Bellarmino University is pleased to recognize and honor Bellarmine alumnus and former Trustee Michael J. Stone, Class of 1970, for his continued guidance and tremendous support for his alma mater.

Mr. Stone, who graduated with a degree in Political Science from Bellarmine and who also holds a law degree, has been a consistent donor to Bellarmine for more than 40 years and is always one of the first to step up to champion students' needs.

Mr. Stone is a member of the Board of Directors for RLI, a specialty property and casualty insurance and surety bond company, and retired president and chief operating officer of RLI and Mt. Hawley Insurance Companies. RLI is traded on the NYSE and has offices in all 50 states.

He had previously served as executive vice president and vice president for claims for RLI. He joined RLI in 1996 from The Travelers Insurance Company in Hartford, Conn., where he served as vice president for liability claims. From 1970-76, he worked at Crawford & Company Insurance Adjusters, serving as claims adjuster and supervising multi-line casualty property claims in Kentucky and Indiana.

Mr. Stone was named the 2000 Hammond Memorial Scholarship Fund Claims Person of the Year.

In 2014, he was inducted into the Bellarmine University Alumni Association's Gallery of Distinguished Graduates.

That same year, he was instrumental in making Bellarmine's first-ever "Day of Giving" a major success. He motivated and inspired alumni donors by offering a generous challenge match. Through his generosity, Bellarmine surpassed its goal and secured 421 alumni donors—many of them first-time givers—and more than \$150,000 in one day!

Day of Giving has grown from this remarkable beginning into a highly successful annual event that has raised more than \$1.8 million total for the benefit of countless Bellarmine students.

Mr. Stone has said that the best career advice he ever received was from his father, who encouraged him and his eight siblings to get an education and then get a job.

Mr. Stone, who is a living testament to the validity of that advice, has also demonstrated his belief in the importance of education through the company culture at RLI. New hires must have achieved a grade-point average between 3.0 and 4.0 in their most recent course of schooling. Employees become owners of the company, sharing in RLI's success through Peoria's first employee stock ownership plan.

At Bellarmine, we promote academic inquiry rooted in the liberal arts tradition—critical thinking, communication, collaboration, creativity, and compassion—with an expectation of excellence. We also place high importance on the thoughtful stewardship of our university resources.

Throughout his career, Mr. Stone has demonstrated a commitment to excellence and has remained a steadfast supporter of his alma mater—not just through his financial gifts, but also through his time and talents.

Bellarmino University is honored, therefore, to award on this, the 13th day of May in the year 2022, the degree of Doctor of Humane Letters, *Honoris Causa*, to Michael J. Stone '70.

CITATION FOR HONORARY DEGREE RUSSELL F. COX



Bellarmine University is pleased to recognize and honor Russell F. Cox, president and CEO of Norton Healthcare and chair of the Bellarmine Board of Trustees, for his decades of partnership with Bellarmine to the great benefit of our students and the region.

Norton Healthcare is a leader in serving adult and pediatric patients from throughout Metro Louisville, the Commonwealth of Kentucky and beyond. The not-for-profit hospital and healthcare system is Louisville's third-largest employer, with more than 17,000 employees, over 1,500 employed medical providers and approximately 2,000 total physicians on its medical staff.

It is also by far the top employer of Bellarmine University graduates, hiring 15.3 percent of the graduates in the Class of 2021, for example.

Mr. Cox has more than 38 years of executive experience in health care. Before joining Norton Healthcare in 2000, he spent six years as executive director of resource operations at Caritas Health Services in Louisville and worked in various executive roles at Humana Inc., Galen Healthcare and Columbia/HCA Healthcare Corp.

He assumed his current position at Norton in 2017 after serving in several other roles including vice president of support services; senior vice president, operations and development; executive vice president; and executive vice president and chief operating officer.

In 2019, Mr. Cox was named one of the Most Admired CEOs in the Louisville area by Louisville Business First, and in 2020, he was inducted into the Kentuckiana Business Hall of Fame.

Norton Healthcare's long partnership has been truly transformational for Bellarmine, helping the university to prepare the great leaders in health care that the future workforce demands.

The partnership dates to 2002 and the university's first cohort of Lansing Scholars, whose costs are partially covered by the Norton Healthcare Foundation and who begin their careers at Norton Healthcare upon graduation, where they are eligible to have their loans forgiven.

In July 2009, Norton Healthcare and Bellarmine formed a collaborative nursing venture to further address the community's healthcare workforce needs. In 2013, that partnership was renewed and a second focus—sports medicine—was added. In 2016, Bellarmine and Norton Healthcare added strategic ventures related to campus wellness.

In 2022, Bellarmine University and Norton Healthcare announced a five-year, \$2.4 million agreement that will expand the organization's partnerships with Bellarmine in sports medicine, campus wellness and nursing. It is the largest funded partnership in Bellarmine's history.

The partnership will help Bellarmine to meet the greater level of health support required for student-athletes by Bellarmine's rise to NCAA Division I, including additional athletic trainers; increase staffing in the Bellarmine clinic; and develop new academic programming.

Mr. Cox further supports Bellarmine University through the wisdom and enthusiasm he has brought to the Board of Trustees for the past 11 years and as the current chair.

At Bellarmine, we educate students to create meaningful lives for themselves while also improving the human condition. Bellarmine's collaboration with Norton Healthcare enriches our students' education and prepares them to be the professionals and leaders we all will need in the future. This is the best kind of partnership, one in which we all work together, and we all win.
