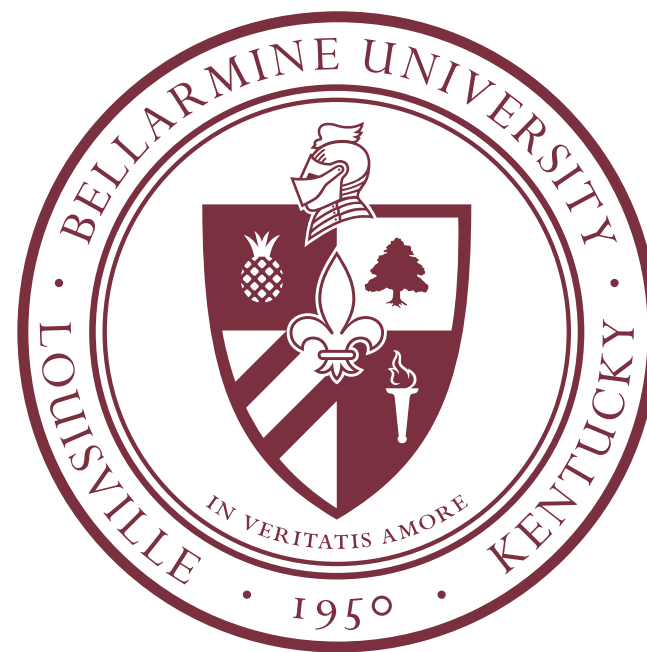

HISTORY & TRADITION

Bellarmino University opened on October 3, 1950, under the sponsorship of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Louisville and with the special assistance of the Conventual Franciscan Fathers. Bellarmine was one of the first schools in the Commonwealth of Kentucky open to all races. The first 42 graduating seniors, “The Pioneer Class,” received their diplomas in 1954.

In 1968, Bellarmine merged with Ursuline College, a Catholic college for women established by the Ursuline Sisters of Louisville in 1938. The merger created a coeducational student body, and Bellarmine became independent with a self-perpetuating governing board. In 2000, the Board of Trustees voted to change the name of the institution from Bellarmine College to Bellarmine University to reflect its true status as a comprehensive master’s institution.

Bellarmino University is made up of the Bellarmine College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Health Professions (including the Donna and Allan Lansing School of Nursing and Clinical Sciences and the School of Movement and Rehabilitation Sciences), the W. Fielding Rubel School of Business, the Annisley Frazier Thornton School of Education, and the School of Continuing and Professional Studies. Bellarmine offered its first graduate program, the Master of Business Administration, in 1975. Today, Bellarmine offers numerous graduate and doctoral programs in business, communication, education and healthcare.

Bellarmino University is situated on approximately 175 acres of gently rolling terrain that slopes down to Louisville’s historic Beargrass Creek. The campus currently consists of more than 40 buildings encompassing nearly 1 million square feet of space. Many of Bellarmine’s buildings—most notably Our Lady of the Woods Chapel, W.L. Lyons Brown Library, Anniversary Hall, Norton Health Science Center and the Siena residence hall complex—are recognized for their outstanding architecture.

Bellarmino University was founded in the rich tradition of Catholic education. This tradition emphasizes academic excellence, encourages a vigorous intellectual climate which affirms the compatibility of faith and reason, and nurtures a campus culture and community which reflect basic Judeo-Christian values including concern for each individual as a whole person and service to others. As the premier independent Catholic university in the South, Bellarmine remains firmly grounded in its mission to prepare students to make a living and a life worth living.

BELLARMINE DEGREES

Bellarmino University offers doctoral degrees in Education, Leadership in Higher Education, Education and Social Change, Physical Therapy, Nursing Practice, and Health Professions Education; an Educational Specialist Degree in Instructional Leadership and School Administration; master’s degrees in Athletic Training, Business Administration, Communication, Digital Media, Education, Health Science, Nursing, and Teaching; Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Health Science, Bachelor of Music, Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Science in Nursing. The requirements for these degrees reflect the university’s emphasis on the liberal arts.

HISTORY & TRADITION

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Bellarmino University graduates wear academic regalia in the time-honored traditions of higher learning. The bachelor’s gown has a closed front and long, pointed open sleeves hanging nearly to the knees. These gowns are traceable to an ancient monastic choir garb known as the cuculla. The doctorate and master’s gowns have an opening at the level of the wrist to free the hands. The portion of the sleeve below the opening is straight at the back and has, in front, a long semi-circular cut-out.

Symbolic of the degree is the academic hood made of the same material as the gown. The master’s hood is 42 inches in length with a three-inch velvet border. Doctor’s degree hoods are four feet in length and have side panels that create a three-dimensional effect. The hood is silk-lined in the colors of the institution: scarlet and silver. The color of the velvet strip indicates the field of study in which the degree was earned. Bellarmine hoods are trimmed in golden yellow of science, apricot of nursing, light blue of education, drab of business administration, sage of physical therapy, crimson of communication and royal blue of philosophy.

The appropriate cap for all degrees is the familiar head piece known as the mortar board. It is adorned with a tassel worn hanging to the left of the face.

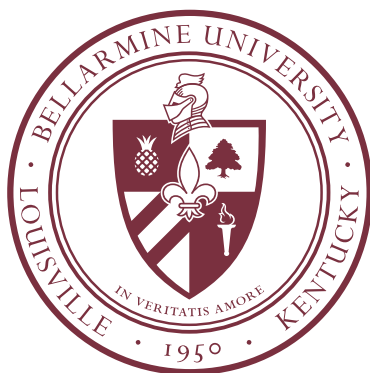
In addition to their academic regalia, graduates who have achieved special honors or distinctions may wear sashes, cords or medallions that signify their accomplishments.

LATIN HONORS

Undergraduate students who have earned Latin Honors are distinguished by the medallions worn at the front of their gowns.

A medallion with a scarlet ribbon represents a *Cum Laude* (GPA 3.50-3.69) graduate. A medallion with a silver ribbon represents a *Magna Cum Laude* (GPA 3.70-3.84) graduate. A medallion with a gold ribbon represents a *Summa Cum Laude* (GPA 3.85-4.00) graduate.

THE BELLARMINE SEAL



Bellarmino's official seal consists of the coat of arms and university motto framed within three circles, the band of which states the institution's name, Bellarmine University; location, Louisville, Kentucky; and founding date, 1950.

The shield has four quadrants created by a cross, emblematic of the university's founding in 1950 by the Archdiocese of Louisville in the distinguished Catholic tradition of higher education, the oldest continuing tradition of higher education in the history of the western world. Bellarmine continues to be inspired by the excellent values in its founding Catholic tradition, in the inclusive spirit of Thomas Merton.

The coat of arms contains several symbols. The **PINEAPPLE** is the traditional symbol of hospitality.

The **STRIPES** represent five important values in the Catholic tradition and the Bellarmine educational experience: the intrinsic dignity and value of every human being; our responsibility to educate the whole person—mind, body, heart and soul; the mystery, interconnectedness and ongoing nature of God's creation and "the hidden wholeness of things"; the importance of both faith and reason as ways of seeking the truth; and the call to each of us to develop our gifts and abilities to the fullest to give glory to God, serve those in need and make the world a better place.

The **FLEUR DE LIS** is the emblem of the city of Louisville.

The Bellarmine motto is *IN VERITATIS AMORE*, "In the love of truth."

At the top center of the shield appears the **HELMET** of the Bellarmine Knight mascot, established by founding President Alfred Horrigan, who was enchanted with the Arthurian legend and the quest for the Holy Grail.

The **URSULA LAUREL TREE**, from the Ursuline College coat of arms, symbolizes Bellarmine's participation in the legendary Ursuline education tradition (the schools merged in 1968).

The **TORCH** represents the light of truth and love.

THE UNIVERSITY MACE

Bellarmino, the academic mace of Bellarmine University, symbolizes the office and the authority of the President of the University, and descends from regal scepters and medieval battle maces. In academic procession, the mace is carried before the President.

Bellarmino University Board of Trustees Chair Emeritus Owsley Brown Frazier commissioned Louisville artist Scott Boyer to design a new mace to celebrate the university's new name and seal.

The mace represents a diploma scroll, formed into a torch of light, a traditional symbol of the illuminating power of education as it casts out the darkness of ignorance with the light of truth and knowledge.

Prominent on the mace is the official seal of Bellarmine University.

The heart of the mace houses a Celtic cross, symbolizing the Catholic origin and institutional identity of Bellarmine University. Near the cross appears an Ursula Laurel tree, the symbol of the Ursuline Sisters and Ursuline College which merged with Bellarmine in 1968, bringing the university into the Ursuline tradition of teaching excellence in Catholic higher education.

At the very top of the rolled scroll appear fleurs de lis, the symbol of the great City of Louisville, proud home of Bellarmine University. Finally, at the base of the torch is a representation of a pineapple, the traditional symbol of hospitality and in this case, of the legendary hospitality of the House of the university's patron saint, Cardinal Robert Bellarmine, S.J., and therefore of Bellarmine University itself.

The mace is 36 inches long and weighs 8 lbs. Its artistic beauty is enhanced by gold plating over cast aluminum.

CITATION FOR HONORARY DEGREE NICHOLAS '69 AND VIRGINIA OSBORNE '70 CAROSI



Bellarmino University is pleased to recognize and honor Nicholas '69 and Virginia "Gincy" Osborne '70 Carosi for their tremendous support of their alma mater.

Nick, who grew up in the Washington, D.C., area, and Gincy, who is from Atlanta, met as students at Bellarmine, and the university holds a special place in their hearts. "Bellarmino is the roots of our relationship," Gincy has said. "We have great respect for the university, and fond memories."

The couple married in July 1970 and made their home in Virginia, where Nick Carosi became the third generation in his family (his son is now the fourth) to work at Arban & Carosi, one of the preeminent architectural precast concrete manufacturers in North America. The firm began as a partnership between Mr. Carosi's grandfather, a sculptor and plaster artisan from Italy, and a cast-stone craftsman who was also an Italian immigrant. Mr. Carosi is now the retired owner and president of Arban & Carosi. Gincy Carosi taught art and ran an interior design business.

The couple remained connected to Bellarmine through the years, with Nick Carosi serving a term on the Board of Trustees. During one visit, then-President Joseph J. McGowan mentioned that he would love for Bellarmine to have a more distinctive entrance.

In 2013, the Carosis made that happen when they donated St. Robert's Gate, the 3½-story concrete arch at the university's Newburg Road entrance. The arch has since become emblematic of the Bellarmine experience and the university's commitment to hospitality.

Another example of the Carosis' generosity is not as visible but is no less important. In 2021, they created the Nicholas '69 and Virginia Osborne '70 Carosi Endowed Scholarship. First preference goes to a student who attended St. John's College High School in Washington, D.C., which Nick Carosi attended. Second preference is a student who attended a Catholic high school in Virginia or the D.C. Metro area.

The Carosis say they want to elevate Bellarmine's reputation in the mid-Atlantic area and hope that scholarship recipients will express their appreciation by paying it forward for the next generation.

In 1998, Nick Carosi was inducted into the Bellarmine University Alumni Association's Gallery of Distinguished Graduates, and in 2013, the association named Nick and Gincy Carosi the Alumni of the Year.

CITATION FOR HONORARY DEGREE DR. MARK LYNN AND MRS. CINDY LYNN



Bellarmino University is pleased to recognize and honor Dr. Mark Lynn and Mrs. Cindy Lynn for the significant difference their philanthropy has made at Bellarmine and in Metro Louisville.

Dr. Lynn was the founder, president and CEO of Dr. Mark Lynn & Associates, the sixth-largest optometry practice in the United States with more than 90 locations throughout Kentucky, Georgia, Indiana, Mississippi, Missouri and Tennessee. He sold the practice in 2021.

In 2020, the Lynns founded Lynn Family Sports Vision & Training to improve the visual and cognitive systems of athletes in addition to creating specialized treatment plans for greater recovery from concussion, traumatic brain injury and strokes. Lynn Family Sports Vision & Training has been a key partner for the performance training and recovery of Bellarmine's student-athletes.

Evidence of the Lynn Family's generosity may be found throughout the City of Louisville in the sports facilities they have funded, most notably the new Lynn Family Stadium, home to Louisville FC and Racing Louisville. Dr. Lynn also serves as chair of the Kentucky State Fair Board.

The Lynns have created scholarships at multiple universities, including Bellarmine, that are aimed at reducing barriers for educational attainment.

Both of the Lynns relied on loans and scholarships to go to college, in addition to working full-time. Eight years after high school, they had significant student-loan debt.

"After years of struggling, we promised ourselves that if we were ever in a position to help others from enduring the same hardships, then we would do so," they said.

At Bellarmine, where Dr. Lynn serves on the Board of Trustees, they created the Dr. Mark and Cindy Lynn Endowed Scholarship in 2020.

The fund provides scholarships to undergraduate students who demonstrate financial need. The Lynns hope that recipients will remember that they were given an opportunity to achieve their goals and will one day do the same in return.

To the Lynns, Bellarmine represents a means of achieving goals the right way, for the right cause, that will lead to success. "It stands for being true to God, others and yourself, in that order. It is a symbol of hope and the future, and we are proud to be a small part of this great cause."

At Bellarmine, we are committed to making a transformative Bellarmine education accessible and affordable to students from all backgrounds, while ensuring the university's financial stability for decades to come.

The wise counsel and financial support of Mark and Cindy Lynn is critical to helping us live our mission. The Lynns understand that the success of our students ultimately becomes the success of our community and region.

CITATION FOR HONORARY DEGREE MARY GWEN WHEELER



Bellarmino University is pleased to recognize and honor Mary Gwen Wheeler for her career-long commitment to increasing educational attainment in Metro Louisville and beyond.

Ms. Wheeler is a policy consultant and strategist who focuses on strengthening communities, particularly through educational opportunities, by applying her experience in non-profit management and board leadership and local government leadership to public and institutional policy change and building public will.

Ms. Wheeler is also a member of the Board of Directors for Evolve502, a community organization focused on removing barriers of poverty and institutional racism for Louisville's public-school students on their journey to college and post-graduate success. She was key in igniting community support for the Evolve402 Promise Scholarship, which gives every graduate of Jefferson County Public Schools the opportunity to attend Simmons College or any Kentucky Community & Technical College, including Jefferson Community & Technical College, tuition-free for two years. The initiative gives every JCPS graduate the chance to earn a technical credential, workforce certification or associate degree.

She also serves on the board for the National Center for Families Learning, a national nonprofit that supports family success and well-being through education. NCFL has worked for more than 30 years to eradicate poverty through education solutions for families.

In 2010, Ms. Wheeler founded and served as executive director for 55,000 Degrees, a civic organization focused on increasing educational attainment in the Louisville Metro area through the addition of 55,000 degrees in the region by 2020. The initiative was hailed nationally as a success and was credited with increasing post-secondary attainment in Louisville by 8 percent.

Ms. Wheeler served as the Senior Advisor for Education & Youth to the Mayor of Louisville for over a decade, in addition to serving as Louisville Metro Government's Cabinet Secretary for Health & Family Services and Director of Policy and Management. She also served on the Kentucky Board of Education.

At Bellarmine, we believe that education not only prepares graduates to compete successfully for 21st century jobs; it also prepares them for a greater quality of life. And we are determined to find innovative ways to make a Bellarmine education accessible and affordable to students of all backgrounds.

Ms. Wheeler realized early in her career that the systemic barriers of poverty, institutional racism and cost were moving the life-changing opportunity of a postsecondary credential or degree out of the reach of most low-income and many middle-income students—and she has devoted her life to pulling those barriers down.

Bellarmino University is pleased to recognize and honor the Rev. Dr. Clyde F. Crews, a 1966 Bellarmine alumnus and longtime Bellarmine faculty member and administrator who is celebrating his 50th year in the priesthood.

Fr. Crews was born in Louisville in 1944, graduated from St. Xavier High School and earned a B.A. degree from Bellarmine College in 1966, graduating *summa cum laude*. As a Woodrow Wilson Fellowship recipient, he received his master's degree and Ph.D. in History of Christian Thought at Fordham University in New York City in 1968 and 1972. In

1973, he was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Louisville after pastoral study at St. Meinrad Seminary.

Fr. Crews returned to Bellarmine that same year as a Theology professor and went on to enjoy a long career at his alma mater, including 34 years in the classroom. He served in numerous roles including academic dean, chair of the Theology Department and director of the Merton Center.

In 2007, he retired from Bellarmine's faculty and was named university historian and archival coordinator.

Fr. Crews is also a noted author. In addition to dozens of articles and reviews in scholarly journals, periodicals and newspapers, he has written numerous books focusing on religion in the United States and Louisville, and on Louisville history. In 2017, he wrote a history of Bellarmine University entitled *In Veritatis Amore*. He is also co-founder of the Louisville Historical League.

Fr. Crews was named Bellarmine Alumnus of the Year for 1975-76 and is a member of Bellarmine's Gallery of Distinguished Graduates.

In 2022, an anonymous group of donors at Bellarmine created a scholarship in his name. The Fr. Clyde Crews '66 Endowed Scholarship will ensure that generations of students to come will remember his legacy.

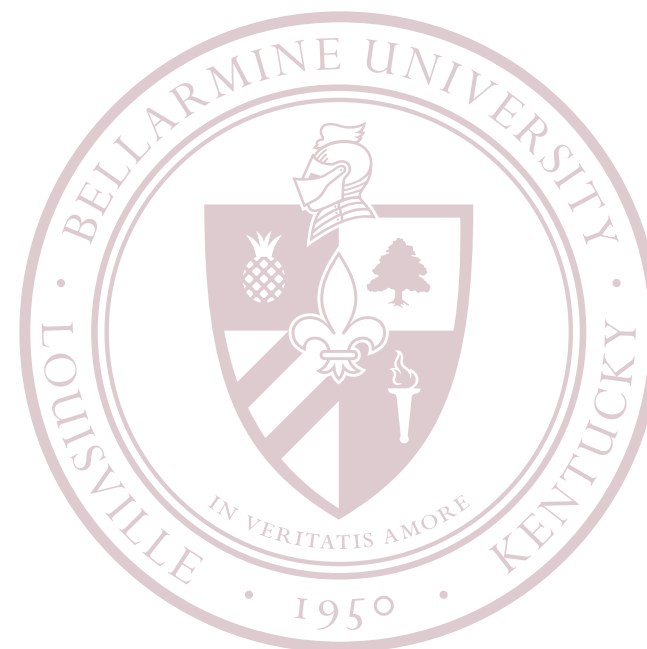

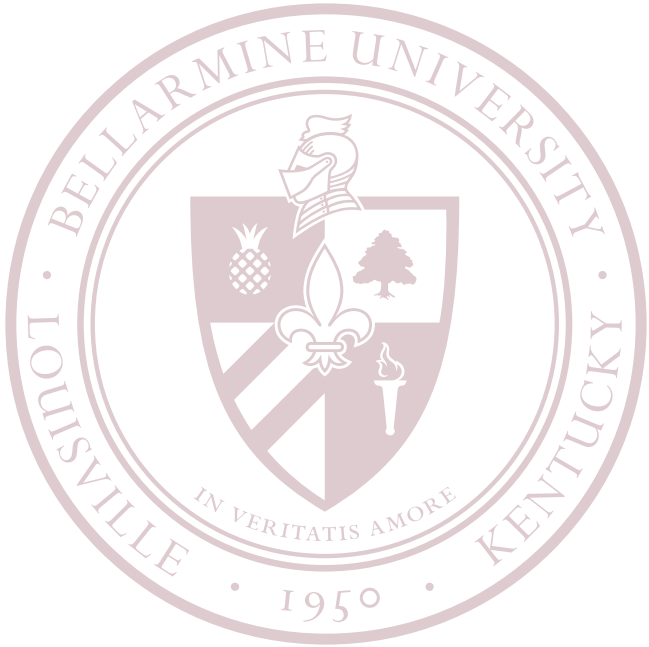

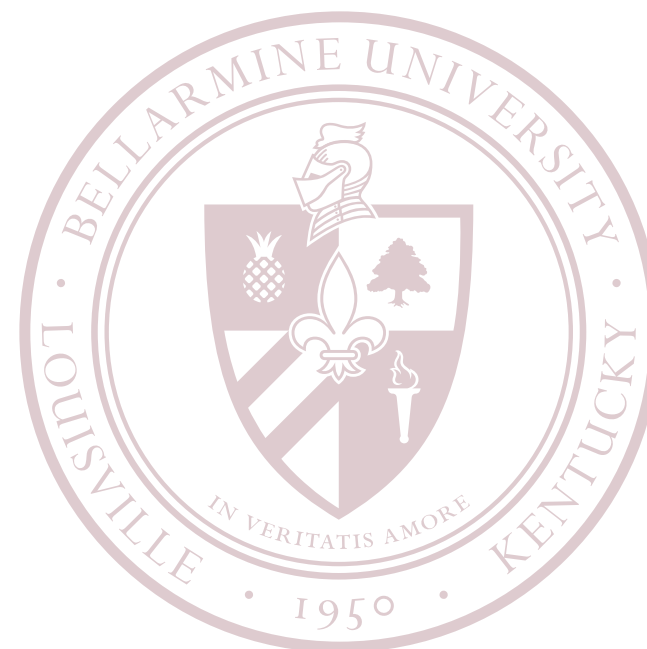
