## Tips for paraphrasing:

- Suspend your own beliefs for a time and put yourself in the position of the author whose passage your are paraphrasing, so as not to misrepresent their message.
- Use your own words and sentence structure.
- Always put quotes around any words or phrases that are unique to the source.
- Always include in-text citation for paraphrases, which includes the author's last name and page number, just like a quote.
