VERITAS SOCIETY'S 30th ANNIVERSARY PROJECT: NEW SPACE AT THE WATTERSON MEDICAL CENTER

The Veritas Society is getting a new classroom! Beginning this Fall, Veritas will be hosting many classes in a brand-new 70-person classroom in the recently renovated first-floor suite of the Watterson Medical Centerson Medical Center (WMC) that is just over a mile down the road on Newburg Road. This new space marks a significant milestone, as Veritas has steadily grown which means many of our classes have higher demand then the 40-50 seat on-campus classrooms we typically use. The space is also multifunctional and will be able to host some of our more hands-on courses that need open space, such as yoga, tai-chi, and drumming.

In March, the Veritas Board of Directors heard a presentation about the space from 2 Bellarmine Administrators, Dr. Tony Brosky, Dean of the School of Movement and Rehabilitation Sciences and Marisa Zoeller, Director of Donor Relations, and The Thrive Center CEO Sheri Rose. Bellarmine, with the help of The Thrive Center and donors, is currently working on a 1.6 million dollar project renovating the two of the first floor suites. One of the suites will be rented by The Thrive Center as they will be relocating from their previous Main Street building. The second suite contains the 70-person classroom that is equipped with nesting tables and state of the art AV equipment. The classroom is on the first floor right inside the lobby that is easily accessibly from the parking lots with no need to navigate hills, steps, or ramps.

"This classroom represents more than just a room—it's a symbol of our enduring partnership with Bellarmine and The Veritas Office's response to changing needs within our membership," said Veritas Liaison Abigail Walsh. "We recognize the accessibility issues that many of our members have on campus, and hope this is a near-by solution that allows us to accommodate our members while staying close to campus."




















STAY ACTIVE THIS SUMMER WITH VERITAS!



MEET THE NEW OFFICERS




