

THE NATIONAL DEBT: \$23 TRILLION AND COUNTING!

In fiscal year 2019 the government spent roughly \$984 billion more than it took in in the tax base. When deficits rise, so too does the debt. As the debt rises, so does the debate! Many say the country is in dire financial straits, unable to sustain rising interest payments, facing a potential downgrade of the debt rating, promoting fiscal irresponsibility, and creating a burden to future generations. Others maintain the debt is not a major concern to the health of the U.S. economy — that government spending stimulates the economy and provides essential services to society. As we analyze the growing debt numbers, you will sharpen your economic skills and become an intelligent voice on this major economic issue.
