

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> "Adjusted cohort size" reflects exclusions allowed per the IPEDS standard. These include the death or permanent disability of a student, leave for active duty military service, leave for foreign aid service or leave for an official church-based mission.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> "Length of time to degree" is measured per the IPEDS standard, which assumes a typical bachelor's degree takes four years to complete. Thus, four years is considered 100% of normal time. Hence, five years is 125% of normal time and six years is 150% of normal time.
