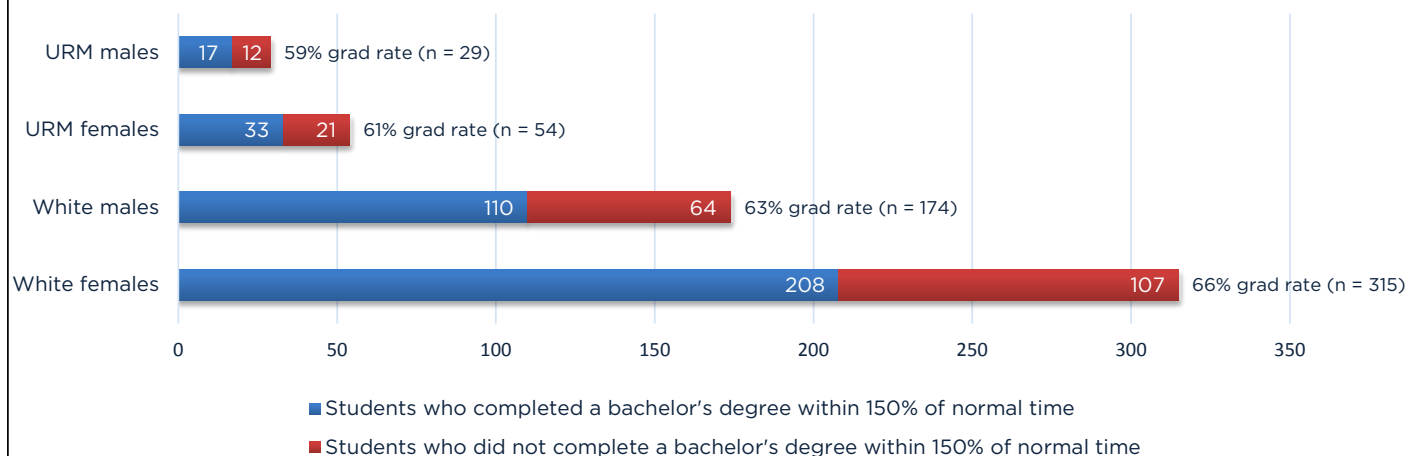

¹ "Adjusted cohort size" reflects exclusions allowed per the IPEDS standard. These include the death or permanent disability of a student, leave for active duty military service, leave for foreign aid service or leave for an official church-based mission.

² "Length of time to degree" is measured per the IPEDS standard, which assumes a typical bachelor's degree takes four years to complete. Thus, four years is considered 100% of normal time. Hence, five years is 125% of normal time and six years is 150% of normal time.

³ "Underrepresented Minority" (URM) is a combined category that includes students who identify as Hispanic or Latino, Asian, Black or African American, Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander and Two or more races. There is a non-significant correlation of $-.04$ ($p = n.s.$) between minority status and six-year graduation rate, and a non-significant correlation of $-.03$ ($p = n.s.$) between sex and six-year graduation rate.
