An ABPTRFE-accredited program is permitted to reproduce the ABPTRFE-accredited program logo on any educational and promotional materials directly related to the program. An electronic version of this logo will be sent to you by e-mail. Such copyright permission is granted solely to programs with approved accreditation status.
