## **Frequently Asked Questions**

- What are the resident halls like?
  - Scholars will be assigned double occupancy rooms with either communal or suite style restrooms.
- Will there a microwave or mini fridge available?
  - A microwave and mini fridge will be provided to each room, so Scholars will be sharing with a roommate. Scholars will not be able to bring additional appliances as these are already provided.
- What size will the beds be?
  - Residence hall mattresses require extra-long sheets measuring 36" x 80" (Twin XL). Scholars should bring bedding and linens, as these will not be provided.
- What is the cost of laundry?
  - Laundry services are free. Scholars should bring their own detergent and dryer sheets.
- Will toilet paper be provided?
  - Yes, toilet paper will be provided; however, no other toiletries will be supplied. Scholars should bring their own cleaning supplies, hand towel, hand soap, etc.
- Are electronic devices allowed?
  - Scholars may bring their own cell phones to use in their rooms. TV sets, personal computers, personal DVD players, smart watches, tablets, and E-readers are not allowed.
- What happens if a Scholar gets sick while on campus?
  - Routine medical concerns may be treated by nursing services provided by the on campus health clinic (a small fee may be applicable). As appropriate, scholars will be treated for major injuries and illnesses at Norton Immediate Care or Norton Audubon Hospital located near campus.
- When will meals be provided?
  - All meals will be served in the main campus cafeteria, University Dining Hall. The meal times are as follows:

- Are there ATMs on campus?
  - Yes. There is a 5/3<sup>rd</sup> bank ATM by University Dining Hall and one located in Harrigan Hall. There is also a Republic Bank ATM located in Siena Terzo.
- Are visitors allowed on campus?
  - Visitors are only permitted on Family Day, which is July 7<sup>th</sup>. No other visitors are allowed without permission from the Campus Director, Jen Price.
- Can a Scholar receive personal mail or packages on campus?

- Will there be a curfew?
  - There will be a 10:30 PM curfew on weeknights (Sunday through Thursday) and an 11:00 PM curfew on weekends. At curfew, all Scholars must sign in with their Resident Advisor on their hall. Scholars may not leave the residence hall after curfew.
- Will church transportation be provided?
  - Opportunities for Scholars to continue their faith traditions will be available. Transportation to and from services may be provide by the GSP and/or by local churches.
- How do I get to campus?
  - From I-71 (Southbound): Follow I-71 South to I-264 West (Watterson Expressway). Stay on I-264 to the Newburg Road North Exit 15A.
     Follow Newburg Road 1.5 miles to Bellarmine.
  - From I-64 West (Westbound): Follow I-64 West to I-264 West (Watterson Expressway). Stay on I-264 to the Newburg Road North Exit 15A. Follow Newburg Road 1.5 miles to Bellarmine.
  - From I-64 East (*Eastbound*): Follow I-64 East to I-65 South. Follow I-65 South to I-264 East (Watterson Expressway). Stay on I-264 to the Newburg Road North Exit 15. Turn left and follow Newburg Road 1.5 miles to Bellarmine.

- From I-65 (Southbound): Follow I-65 South across the Kennedy Bridge to I-264 East (Watterson Expressway). Stay on I-264 to the Newburg Road North Exit 15. Turn left and follow Newburg Road 1.5 miles to Bellarmine.
- From I-65 (*Northbound*): Follow I-65 North to I-264 East (Watterson Expressway). Stay on I-264 to the Newburg Road North Exit 15.
   Turn left and follow Newburg Road 1.5 miles to Bellarmine.
