

## Methodology:

Entering student numbers (full-time traditional and full-time nontraditional) are reconciled with the Colleague cohort code. Regardless of IPEDS-allowed exclusions, the original number above is maintained as it appears in Colleague. However, retention and four-, five- and six-year graduation rates are calculated using the adjusted total (after exclusions from IPEDS). See notes below.

- 1. Initial 2018 cohort was 653; adjusted cohort is 652.
- 2. Initial 2016 cohort was 635; adjusted cohort is 633.
- 3. Initial 2014 cohort was 665; adjusted cohort is 664.
- 4. Initial 2013 cohort was 674; adjusted cohort is 673.
- 5. Initial 2011 cohort was 600; adjusted cohort is 595.
- 6. Initial 2010 cohort was 577; adjusted cohort is 573.
- 7. Initial 2009 cohort was 602; adjusted cohort is 599.

Graduation rate is calculated through August 31 of the fourth, fifth and sixth year post-cohort entry.
