Non-Traditional Field Placement Sites for Diverse Experiences

- **Home of the Innocents:** licensed residential facilities for abandoned, abused, neglected and homeless children, ages 6 to 21. The on-site school program provides educational services to students who reside at the emergency shelter and the residential facility.
- **Binet School:** provides successful learning experiences for those students, ages 5 to 21, with multiple disabilities who need a more structured and supportive environment than that which is available in other Jefferson County Public School settings.
- **Waller-Williams Environmental School:** special school for students with severe and profound emotional and/or behavioral disabilities. The school serves students from K-8th grade in a highly structured environment and utilizes a token economy behavior management system.
- **ESL Newcomer Academy:** provides a welcoming and respectful environment to meet the unique linguistic, academic and social/emotional needs of sixth through tenth grade English language learners (ELLs) enrolling in the Jefferson County Public School district, who are at the beginning levels of English proficiency.
- **Bellewood:** a private child-care facility with an on-site educational program operated by the Jefferson County Public Schools. The school program is designed to enable students to make a successful transition to a public school. Bellewood serves boys & girls, ages 13 to 18, who are currently unable to attend a regular Jefferson County Public School.
- **Maryhurst:** provides intensive treatment in residential settings for girls with severe emotional trauma and destructive behaviors. Special education services are provided based on students' Individual Education Plans. The population served is females, ages 12-18 (Grades 6-12).
- **Buechel Metropolitan High:** part of the Jefferson County Public Schools, it serves the need for an alternative program for secondary students who exhibit disruptive or misguided behavior in the schools. Students that attend Buechel Metropolitan are referred by the office of Student Services, juvenile court, or state and county agencies.
- **Churchill Park School:** part of the Jefferson County Public Schools, it provides services for 3- and 4-year-old students - Head Start, Pre-kindergarten, Jumpstart and (ECE) classrooms. The school also serves students (ages 5 - 21) who have moderate to severe disabilities and who need a specialized program that is more flexible than what is available in other JCPS settings. Many students have medical needs requiring a nurse to be on site.
- **Kentucky School for the Blind:** a K-12 public school serving Kentucky students who are blind and visually impaired. The school serves approximately 70 students and is a part of the Kentucky Department of Education. The school provides residential dormitories for those students who reside on campus during the school week.

- **Nativity Academy at St. Boniface:** a private middle school in the Catholic tradition, it serves students of academic promise in the Louisville area from low income families. Its mission is to evoke a passion for learning in its students so that all may reach their full potential.
- **Sons of Issachar at Canaan Church:** serves male students (3rd - 8th grade) in an after-school program, Monday through Thursday, from 3pm - 7pm. The program's mission is to enforce the right of students to be encouraged to learn in an environment devoted to meeting their academic, emotional, social and physical needs.
- **Volunteers of America Family Emergency Shelter:** provides school and tutoring services to K-12 students whose families are residents due to homelessness. Programming includes organized tutoring and after school programs.
