## Nursing Admissions

- GPA: 3.00 on a 4.00 Scale
- BIOL 108, BIOL 109, Chem 214 and BIOL 202 (Micro) – Grade C or better
- NURS 200 (Nutrition) – Grade B- or better
- A student is not eligible for admission to the nursing major if he/she earns three or more unsatisfactory grades in the same course or any combination of these five courses: BIOL 108, BIOL 109, BIO 300, CHEM 214, and NURS 200. An unsatisfactory grade is defined above; or two withdrawals from any single course or combination of the five courses listed. The policy refers to the final course grade, not a grade on a specific assignment.
- Provide proof of successful completion of a Medicaid approved Certified Nurse Aide (CNA) or State Registered Nurse Aide (SRNA) course to the nursing department prior to the first day of beginning nursing courses. Students do not need to complete the state certification examination.

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# Program Overview

- Admission Process: Minimum 3.0 High School GPA
- Summer Bridge Program (June 30 - July 31, 2025):
  - 1 week orientation, 4 weeks of class (Mon-Thu 9-3:30, Fri 9-11:30)
  - Complete 7 credit hours (General Education, Intro to Nursing, Academic Success)
  - Receive a Start-Up Success Kit
- Fall & Spring Semesters:  
12-13 credit hours, plus support sections
- BSN Completion: 3 more years post-high school, with an expedited MSN application option

# Program Cost

- Dual Enrollment Year: \$15,000
  - \$1,500 for Bridge Program (7 credits)
  - \$6,750 each for Fall & Spring Semesters
- Future Years: Based on financial need and scholarships
- Scholarships: Full tuition and housing options available
- FAFSA: Determines Student Aid Index (SAI) and financial aid



# Scholarships & Financial Aid

- Scholarships funded by generous donors
- Every student that completes the dual enrollment year of the Career-Ready BSN program will receive a minimum \$29,000 scholarship.
- HOPE Scholarship (tuition & fees) and Public Price Promise (flagship public school price – must live on campus)
- Average tuition paid by students 24/25: Approximately \$16,500
- Some students pay as little as \$0 based on SAI
