

BELLARMINE FACULTY VOLUNTEERS FOR HABITAT

Bellarmine faculty, staff and students have an opportunity once a month to make a difference in the lives of low-income Louis-ville families working to build their own homes with Habitat for Humanity of Metro Louisville. Beginning in fall 2007, the second Saturday of every month has been reserved for a Bellarmine crew (12 people maximum) to volunteer on a Habitat construction site, and all are welcome to participate on a first-come, first-served basis. Several faculty and staff have already participated, in addition to IDC classes last fall.

A nonprofit, ecumenical Christian housing ministry, Habitat for Humanity builds simple and affordable homes in partnership with those in need of decent housing. Families purchase the houses at no profit, through interest-free loans.

Habitat builds alongside families who demonstrate the need and willingness to partner with Habitat. Families invest hundreds of hours of their own "sweat-equity" labor into their houses. Their monthly mortgage payments help fund the construction of more houses.

No matter which department or division we work in, our work relates in some way to Bellarmine students. Undergraduate Research Week is an opportunity for students to show off their best work in their majors. The eighth annual Undergraduate Research Week was April 7-14, 2008.

The week kicks off each year with a poster display and reception. Students presented approximately 115 posters this year to show their research in a wide array of topics from the natural sciences to music technology. Biology, Chemistry, Math, Management Science, Clinical Laboratory Science, and Communication Ethics are a sampling of the departments that were represented.

Other events of the week included multi-media presentations by Communication majors, the opening of the annual student art show, and a set of short plays written or directed by students. One of the events used the Black Box Theatre as the setting for students to read their original poems in open-mic style. A new event this year was a reading of the play "Break Room" by Jordan Kelch, the student artist-in-residence for the Lansing School.
